Bob McGeever Division Superintendent



Hope to see you all at May joint meeting in Rockford.



## Swinton's flat takes first


Ewing Row Modeling Project Chair

Presenting a finely detailed and weathered flat car, Don Swinton placed first in the popular-vote Modeling Project contest at the April SCWD meet. In addition, his telephone-pole load, the result of Ken Hojnacki's Makeand-Take at the March meet, provided a credible load on the 50-foot car. Don's car was placed over a mirror so that you could see some of the underside detail.



Neither first, second or third place modeler is new to the winner's circle in the Modeling Project contest.

Placing second with his "Pickle Car" was Dave Casey. He too had a finely detailed flat car topped with a cucumber. Yep, a cucumber. It was entered in both the Modeling Project and the April Fool freight car popularvote judging. A note on the base of the entry said: "Candidate for the World's Largest Pickle enroute on 50' C&NW flat car # 48059."

In third was an amazing entry from Matt Baumgart. He converted his kit into a depressed-center, heavy load flat car carrying a monster load (don't know what the load is). Load limit listed in the reporting marks on the side of the car listed was a whopping 250,000 pounds. His BNSF 601657 was finely detailed with air hoses and brake releasing rigs.



The only entry from the Youth Group was Nathan Varun's "big gun" flat car. An "army" green, the huge cannon looked to be able to lob a monster shell miles away. He presented his fine effort on a small diorama completed with telephone poles and scenery — including grass, tree, bushes and rocks — and tank engine and box car.



First place finishers left the meet with \$75 gift certificates to Madison Hobby Stop. Second and third place will enjoy \$50 and \$25 certificates, respectively, also at the Madison Hobby Stop.

The Board of Directors meeting for the 2015-2016 South Central Wisconsin Division, Midwest Region, National Model Railroad Association was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on March 13, 2017 by Superintendent Bob McGeever. In attendance were Board members **Dave Lendved, Bob McGeever, Mike Vivion, Phil Hottmann, Jerry Lawler, Ken Hojnacki, Bill Clancy**. <u>Minutes Approval</u>: Minutes for the February 2017 meeting were approved with amendments as to attendance and change of meeting date.

<u>Paymaster Report</u>: Paymaster report was approved. <u>Committee Reports:</u>

**Bad Order:** Everything continues to operate smoothly. **Clinics:** Bob has lined up and details available in the Bad Order.

**Modeling Project for 2016-2017:** Mike Vivion will take back the Chair position. Due to costs, there may be an increase in cost of participation or we may reduce the complexity of the project.

Make and Take Activity: 19 people provided positive feedback

**Door prizes:** 22 were donated for the rail show. Walthers and Kalmbach donated.

**Layout tours:** Ken Hojnacki is hosting the April open house .

**Membership:** The Annual Business meeting will take place as part of the April 2nd meeting

It appears that the show will break even and the board began discussions related to longer term planning for the show to ensure its health.

**Spring Trip:** It was agreed that the Illinois Railroad Museum will be the destination. Date: June 10<sup>th</sup>. It will be a one day trip. Group will meet at the Zor Shrine parking lot and will travel from there. Meeting time will be 8am. We have 29 confirmed and a waiting list is being created in the event that we have cancellations

**Web Site:** The use of Paypal was discussed for managing online Train Show ticket sales. Minimal response to date. It was determined that this is feasible and that we piloted it this year.

**Youth Group:** Youth group had their new layout at the Rail Show and feedback was positive and it was a very busy exhibit with many youngsters visiting the layout and our youth group helping them run trains. This month's meeting will be an operating session at Al Potts'.

**Publicity:** Bob Boelter is going to contact the Wisconsin State Journal and ask for a pdf version of the State Journal article on the  $50^{\text{th}}$  Anniversary of the SCWD Rail Show. This pdf article will be posted on the web site. There will be a cost of ~\$25 for the pdf site.

**Capitol 400:** Bob Boelter has finalized the logo. There is a plan to have a graphic web page and poster up at the Rockford meeting.

**Wes Peat's Speeder:** The speeder was picked up on March 12<sup>th</sup> by the IRR and delivered to them.

**Membership Booth:** Bill Marks has completed the rehab and it will be ready for the Rail Show




railroad badge was discussed. It had been done previously, but is no longer an activity of the group. Jerry agreed to make inquiries with the scouting organizations and report back.

The business meeting was re-convened at 1:30 pm. Mike announced that Bob McGeever was re-elected as Superintendent. A motion was made by Don Swinton, seconded by Paul Mangan and approved unanimously to destroy the ballots. Paymaster Phil Berry gave the yearly treasurer's report summary indicating an anticipated positive cash flow for the year. Attendance was down slightly at the Annual Train Show, but SCWD will break even or better for the event based on the ticket sales, vendor and exhibitor table fees, and excellent sales at the Company Store. After further discussion, a motion was made by Bill Clancy, seconded by Chuck Jordan and approved unanimously to accept the report as presented.

A motion was made by Don Swinton, seconded by Fred Robinson and approved unanimously to close the business meeting. The meeting adjourned at 1:40 pm.




