We are now in the process of counting the omer between Pesah and Shavuot. This daily process reminds us how we should focus ourselves on keeping our Judaism in the forefront of our lives and how yearly we prepare ourselves to again receive the law, as did our ancestors, on the celebration of Shavuot, 7 weeks from Pesah. You will hear us count the omer weekly during Shabbat services and we hope this will be a great reminder to focus your attention on how important you Judaism and Beth Shalom are to you in your life.

Counting the Omer

The Israelites approached Moses and asked him how long would they journey before G-d's revelation. Moses told them that they wait from the second day after they left Egypt it would be 49 days. On the 50th day they were to receive the Torah revealed by G-d.

According to the Torah, when the Israelites reached Canan, they were to make it a holy land. In the springtime when the first sheaves of grain were to be harvested, thanks were to be given to G-d. Before any of the new grain could be eaten a special "OMER" (measure of grain) offering was to be brought to the Temple. This omer offering was to be brought on the second day of Passover. From that day (OMER one) seven weeks were to be counted Nisan 16, April 17 - 30 equals 15 Omer on May one 2022/5782.On Omer 15 another offering was to be brought to the Temple; the offering of the first fruits, the "Bikurim". The days of the omer were days of great joy and celebration. What could make one happier than looking at a field of golden brown grain waving in the wind?

Unfortunately, these days of happiness changed to sadness many years later in the time of Rabbi Akiva. During these days of the "omer" a terrible plague similar to our Covid 19 broke out and many of his 24,000 students died. From that time on the days of the omer are remembered as days of mourning.

<u>Laws of the Omer</u>: As listed above the days of the omer are counted. They are counted in the evening after the "Ma'ariv" service, concisely. The blessing praising G-d's name and acknowledging the fulfillment of the commandment are recited. This is followed by counting the number of weeks and days that have passed in the omer (they are listed in most siddurs).

Laws of Counting: If one has forgotten to count the "omer" at night it must be counted on the following day, without the blessing. The following night, however, he/she is to count again normally. If he/she accidentally skipped an entire day, he/she should still count but no longer recite the blessing. At the conclusion of the Sabbath or Passover the "omer" is counted before the "Havdalah" service is recited.

<u>Lag Ba'omer</u>: In contrast to the other days of the omer the 33rd day is a day of rejoicing. History tells us that none of Rabbi Akiva's students died on this day. It was also on this day that Bar KOCHEA, known as "Akiva's general" won a great victory in the revolution of the Jews against the Romans. On this day none of the laws of mourning apply. This festival day is know as "Lag Ba'omer". Lag are the Hebrew letters for 33, "Ba'omer" meaning "in the omer".
