#### A Service of Tenebrae

The service of Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows," has been practiced by the church since medieval times. Once a service for the monastic community, Tenebrae later became an important part of the worship of the medieval common folk during Holy Week. Today we join Christians of many generations throughout the world in using the liturgy of Tenebrae.

Tenebrae is a prolonged mediation on Christ's suffering. We trace the story of Christ's passion with music which portrays his pathos and candles slowly diminish signaling the cessation of Christ's life. The power of silence and mounting darkness suggest the drama of this momentous day. We ponder the depth of Christ's suffering through mounting darkness.

#### **Prelude**

\*Call to Worship (responsively)

God is light, in whom there is no darkness at all.

Jesus Christ is the light of the world.

And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and we loved darkness rather than light.

#### **Opening Prayer (in unison)**

Come sweet Spirit of God, and as the scriptures are read and the word declared in song, deepen in us the meaning of Christ's sacrifice. Expose once more the depth of human darkness and our love for violence. Expose once more our preference for the darkness and our fear and rejection of the light. As we move into the shadows with Christ, help us to see the light of love in his life, light which darkness cannot conquer. Prepare our hearts for the coming morning of joy, when sin, death and darkness are removed from our world forever. Amen.

#### Litany of Remembrance and Confession

#### Leader:

O people, lament with me our great sin, for the sake of which Christ left his Father's bosom and came to earth.

Of a pure, gentle virgin Jesus was born for us; he gave life to the dead and put aside all sickness until the time arrived that he should be sacrificed for us.

He bore the heavy burden of our sins stretched out on the cross.

Weep with me, that despite his self-giving, evil continues today and we participate in it.

Renew your sense of sorrow over the state of the world, look deeply at Christ's death. And in it see grief at human response to God's redemption.

People: We are silenced by the brutality Christ met in this world. We are awed by the enormity of the love which he demonstrated for us.
