### **Entry Requirements**

This high school tournament is managed by the Wright State University Bowling Club in conjunction with sponsorship and supervision by Stebbins High School. This tournament will observe the rules and regulations of participation and play of the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA). Participation is open to any 2020-2021 school-sponsored bowling team.

The maximum number of teams each day is limited to thirty-two (32) and will be determined based on the date the paid entry is received. First come-first serve. <u>Unpaid entries will NOT be accepted</u> by telephone or E-mail.

Spectator admission of \$7.00 will be charged. Children age 6 & under: N/C. Each team may admit a maximum of 6 uniformed bowlers and two (2) coaches at no charge.

#### **Tournament Format**

There are two (2) separate team tournaments: **GIRLS** on Saturday, December 5, 2020. **BOYS** on Sunday, December 6, 2020. Five (5) participating bowlers per team. Team roster is limited to six (6) bowlers. The format is the same for each day. See the tournament schedule on Page 3.

Qualifying Round: All teams will bowl two (2) team games followed by a break, then followed two (2), 4-game Baker blocks. Based on the total scores from the Qualifying Round, eight (8) teams will advance to the Championship Round. All ties for advancing teams will be broken by a 9th-10th frame roll-off. Qualifying Round lane assignments will be determined by the tournament. TEAM GAME SUBSTITUTIONS - A coach is free to sub any bowler at any time for any reason in any frame or game "at will". However, the game score will not be credited to either the starting or replacement bowler.

<u>MOTE</u>: The scores from the Qualifying Round will only be used to: A) determine the teams that advance to the Championship Round and, B) to determine five (5) individual members of the all-tournament team in each division. The scores from the Qualifying Round do <u>not</u> carry over to the Championship Round.

Championship Round: The Championship Round will consist of an "eliminator" format. The top eight (8) teams, sorted into two 4-team groups (1-4-5-8 & 2-3-6-7) will bowl 4 Baker games across 4 lanes. The top 2 teams from each group will then advance to bowl 4 additional Baker games across 4 lanes. Finally, the top 2 teams will advance to the final Championship Round match consisting of 2 Baker games with the 2-game total determining the tournament champion. The total of the 4 Baker games in each of the 1st 2 blocks will determine the advancers to the next round. Ties for advancing teams in any Championship Round block will be broken by a 9th-10th frame roll-off. Final tournament standings: The top 8 final tournament standings will be identified by the highest losing seed in each Baker block.

<u>Lane play</u>: All teams will bowl on a sport pattern provided by the USBC Collegiate Program. *There will be a separate pattern suitable for each gender*. The lane pattern will be available for viewing in the tournament office at check-in.

<u>Awards</u>: The 1st place team will receive a team trophy. The members of the 1st & 2nd place teams will each receive team medals. The five (5) members of the all-tournament team in each division will receive medals.

High school bowling is a competitive, no handicap, athletic venue. Experiences gained on a collegiate lane pattern force bowlers to work harder on their game to improve basic skills. Having the experience of bowling on a challenging lane pattern better prepares young bowlers to face the multitude of lane conditions found on the road to the high school state championship.

To conduct this tournament, we must follow the safety policies established by these entities in effect on the dates of the tournament. Here are the COVID-19 safety policies in effect as of October, 2020.

- 1. The maximum team roster size is six (6) bowlers & two (2) coaches.
- 2. The maximum number of teams will be thirty-two (32) each day.
- 3. The maximum number of spectators allowed per team will be six (6).

  Coaches will receive 6 tickets to disperse to spectators as desired. Admission: \$7.00 ea.
- 4. **EVERYONE** wears a mask. This <u>includes</u> bowlers, coaches, and spectators.
- Lane Assignments: To reduce social contact, teams will not change lanes during the Qualifying Round. Lanes will be assigned alphabetically by school name as listed in the OHSAA school directory.

The way we will communicate with coaches is by e-mail. If we need to change these safety policies, coaches will be notified via e-mail. It is the coach's responsibility to legibly list his e-mail address on the tournament entry form. It is in the best interest of everyone that we remain safe and have fun at bowling tournaments. The State of Ohio and Beaver-Vu Bowl safety policies are design to offer the safest venue possible. We all hope for "normalcy" in December. As we approach the tournament date, please check your e-mail daily for any changes to these safety policies.
