Hosted by the Durban University of Technology, the **Global Communication Association** invites you to submit your abstracts for the 16th annual convention to be held in Durban, South Africa from June 10 – 12, 2020.

The GCA invites research papers exploring any aspect of issues related to the theme of the conference, including the following broad topics:

- African media and communication methodologies, theories, and perspectives
- Media and their impact on public opinion
- The evolving modes of teaching and learning
- New communication technologies, the Internet, and social media
- Intercultural communication
- News and information flow
- Communication in Rural Communities
- Impact of globalization on South Africa

**ABSTRACT SUBMISSION:** (All submissions should include two separate attachments in Word format)

- A 400-word abstract of the paper or panel proposal should be submitted ELECTRONICALLY to Shakeel Ori at [oris@dut.ac.za](mailto:oris@dut.ac.za) or [GCAconference@dut.ac.za](mailto:GCAconference@dut.ac.za)
- All abstract submissions must be received by **February 20, 2020**, for review and consideration. Acceptance of a paper or panel proposal obligates authors to attend the conference and present the paper.
- The abstract should include research objectives, methodology and significance followed by keywords.
- Poster presentations on topics related to the conference theme are also encouraged. Complete panel proposals maybe submitted to Dr. Yahya R. Kamalipour at [yrkamal@gmail.com](mailto:yrkamal@gmail.com).
- Abstracts will be peer-reviewed by at least two scholars. Authors of the abstracts will be notified of acceptance by **April 1, 2020**.
- A separate document including the name, academic institution, mailing address, phone

- number, email address, and brief author's profile must be submitted for each author.
- If accepted, the full-length paper (not to exceed 25-pages excluding references and tables) must be submitted by **May 1, 2020**. All papers must strictly adhere to *The American Psychological Association* (APA) style manual. For details, visit <https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/05>.
  - Where appropriate, put "STUDENT" in the upper right-hand corner of the title page; indicate whether the paper comes from a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral student.

A selected number of papers, closely related to the theme of the conference, will be published in book format (print and digital), provided they are well-written and adhere to the APA Guidelines.
