# DISTINGUISHED MEMBERS OF THE REGIMENT (DMOR)

*The Special Operations Center of Excellence*



- **Purpose:** Recognize individuals who have made significant and long-lasting contributions to the Psychological Operations Regiment.
- **DMORs are individuals of the same distinguished stature as those selected for Honorary Leadership Positions.** AR 870-21 Para 6-3 (1) e & (3) e – if they have not already been appointed as DMOR, Honorary Leadership appointees will be appointed as DMOR simultaneously with their Honorary Leadership appointment.
- **Criteria:**
  - Nominee **must be a qualified member of the Regiment** (or recognized predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
  - May be Active Army, Army Reserve, or National Guard **retired / separated** officer, warrant officer, enlisted member, or civilian.
  - Successfully completed / graduated the qualification course / requirements of the time.
  - Served in the respective Regiment (or recognized predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
  - In good standing within the Regiment, Service, and Community.
  - Retired or separated for a minimum of four (4) years to allow them the opportunity to acquire continued service to the Regiment and the local community after retirement or separation.
    - Continued service to the Regiment after separation from the military is particularly important to the honors program and can be done through both formal and informal activities, i.e., as a Government Service employee, through Regimental Associations, support to training or Regimental / Organizational events, participation as a Grey Beard, or through routinely visiting / supporting wounded Soldiers of the Regiment and their Families, etc.

# HONORARY LEADERSHIP

*The Special Operations Center of Excellence*



- **Purpose:** The Honorary Colonel (HCOR) and the Honorary Sergeant Major (HSGMOR) of the Regiment provide a living link to the Regiment's historical and operational significance for today's soldiers.
- The primary roles of these special appointees is to perpetuate the prestige, heraldry, history and traditions of the Regiment, thereby enhancing unit morale and esprit de corps.
- **AR 870-21 Para 6-3 (1) e & (3) e – if they have not already been appointed as DMOR, Honorary Leadership appointees will be appointed as DMOR simultaneously with their Honorary Leadership appointment.**
- Honorary Leadership titles do not constitute an actual position, are entirely honorific in nature, and the individuals given these titles perform entirely voluntary services.
- Honorary Leadership appointments will be for three (3) years
- Criteria:
  - Nominee **must be a qualified member of the Regiment** (or recognized predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
  - Must be Active Army, Army Reserve, or National Guard officer, or NCO with the requisite rank of Colonel or above for HCOR or Sergeant First Class or above for HSGMOR.
  - Must have former service in a unit of the PO Regiment.
  - In good standing within the Regiment, Service, and Community.

# HONORARY MEMBERS OF THE REGIMENT (HMOR)

- **Purpose:** Recognize individuals / organizations who have made significant and long-lasting contributions and/or high levels of service and support to the Psychological Operations Regiment.
- HMORs are Soldiers, Civilians, Spouses, or other individuals / organizations who have made a significant contribution or provided an enduring service to the Regiment.
- Criteria:
  - Nominee **is not a qualified member of the Regiment.**
  - May be Active Army, Army Reserve, National Guard or Sister-Service officer, warrant officer, or enlisted member, Civilian, or other individuals or organizations.
  - In good standing within the Regiment, Service, and Community.
