## From the Minister's Mac

### "Ashes to Ashes"

Ash Wednesday is fast approaching, the first day of the season of Lent, a time of self-examination, repentance, prayer, fasting, and meditating on Scripture. Many churches, including ours, will have a special Ash Wednesday service, which includes the imposition of ashes as a sign of our dependence on the grace of God and our recognition of our mortality and need for forgiveness.

Sounds heavy, right? Well, that's probably why Ash Wednesday service is one of the least attended of all worship services, along with Good Friday and the Blue Christmas service. Could it be that we don't like that part of our faith? Is it that we don't like to think about sin, loss, and death? Are we really that kind of Christian that, while we want to accept the grace of God, we don't want to contemplate what it cost Jesus and we certainly don't want to contemplate what it costs us?

I believe most Christians consider service to others a large part of the Christian life. We give of our resources and our very selves out of love for our community and beyond. We are unselfish, unpretentious, down-to-earth people concerned with the spiritual and physical health of our neighbors. All of that is very good and commendable, but is hard to sustain without a little bit of inward focus on our own relationship with God, our identity as Christians, our rejection of sin, and our openness to the power of the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes we get so busy doing for others that we forget to take time to search our own hearts and identify where we are getting it right and where we are missing the mark. I pray that this Lenten Season, all of us will embark on a private faith journey in which we explore our relationship with God and how we might be more faithful in our everyday lives. And I pray that part of that private journey includes our Ash Wednesday service, 2/18/26, at 7:00 pm.

# **MONDAY NIGHT LENTEN STUDY**

## **A Four-Week Study via Zoom**

### **“GIFTED & TALENTED:**

### **Discover and Use Your Spiritual Gifts”**

**3/2, 3/9, 3/16, 3/23 at 7:00 PM**

Using Rev. Jeremy Scott’s book, “Gifted & Talented: Discover and Use Your Spiritual Gifts,” we will explore using the gifts we know we possess and developing gifts we might not have discovered yet! This study is based on Scripture and includes an AI Gifts Assessment of your Spiritual Gifts. See Rev. Lin to sign up and get a book.

**3/2** Lenten Study Week One — You have a part to play!

In Romans 12:1-13, Paul encourages believers to use their gifts. He also warns, “don’t think of yourself more highly than you ought,” but Rev. Scott suggests, “our modern problem is often the opposite: we think too little of ourselves and our gifts. We are all gifted. The first step is to recognize and name those gifts.”

**3/9** Lenten Study Week Two — The Speaking Gifts

In 1 Corinthians 14:1-12, Paul is providing space and opportunity for people to grow and share their gifts. This week, we explore the gifts of Prophecy, Teaching, and Exhorting and Look at practical ways we build up, clarify, and challenge one another in daily life.

**3/16** Lenten Study Week Three — The Action Gifts

In the Gospel of John, Chapter 13:12-20, Jesus demonstrates the power of servant Leadership. This week we explore the gifts of Serving, Giving and Leading, and discuss how they are expressed through simple kindness, practical generosity, and servant-hearted Influence.

**3/23** Lenten Study Week Four — The Heart and the How

In the Gospel of John, Chapter 8:1-11, Jesus stops a stoning and, perhaps more miraculously for his time, does not condemn the woman awaiting her fate. This week, we explore the core gift of Mercy as the choice for reconciliation over retribution, and to synthesize the entire book’s content into a practical, actionable plan for living out our gifts in every area of life.
