# EVENING PRAYER Vespers

April 9, 2025 7:30 p.m.

The SERVICE OF LIGHT may be used to begin Evening Prayer. The service may be begun with a procession in which a large, lighted candle is carried to its stand in front of the congregation.

#### Stand

- **L** Behold, now is the acceptable time;
- **now** is the day of salvation.
- L Turn us again, O God of our salvation,
- **Q** that the light of your face may shine on us.
- L May your justice shine like the sun,
- and may the poor be lifted up.

As the hymn (printed on the next page) is sung, the candles on and near the altar are lighted. When the large candle is used, the candles are lighted from its flame.
