Days for Girls goes to Damongo, Ghana! Submitted by Kerri Green

SIGP recently purchased Days for Girls kits (reusable sanitary pads) for the St. Anne's Girls Secondary School (SAGISS) that the club supports in Damongo, Ghana. Three members (Kerri Green, Carol Hofer, and Rosanne Morrow) travelled to Ghana in November 2019 to distribute these kits!



As the temperature soared to 100 F in Damongo, the SIGP visitors bumped down the dusty, pot-holed covered path leading to SAGISS, and were greeted by 70+ very excited students. The girls had arranged a performance of six different African tribal dances and music to make us feel welcome. It was a very entertaining presentation! The headmaster, Madame Pauline, acknowledged that they didn't have any gifts to give us, except for their beautiful smiles.

SIGP members announced that we brought gifts instead, so schedules were rearranged, and we gathered all of the students later that afternoon to learn about Days for Girls.

Kerri Green, thanks to the DfG flipchart, led an educational seminar focused on puberty,



reproduction, and menstruation. The teenaged girls were surprisingly quiet and attentive!

Finally, each girl was provided a kit, and the fun began. Everyone opened their kits, and we reviewed all of the contents. Each girl received 2 panties, 2 cotton sanitary liners with wings, 8 flannel inserts for the liners, a washcloth, soap, and calendar with instruc-

tions. The girls held up their colorful panties with glee. Kerri then pulled out an extra huge pair of panties to get everyone giggling, and to demonstrate how to use the sanitary liners and inserts. We had each girl affix a



liner to her new panties and practice using the inserts, and then we went around to confirm the placement was correct. After learning how to properly care for the kit and discussion on how to stay healthy, the girls repacked their kits with excitement. In a rural village where they have so little, the girls were thrilled to receive the kits! Their gratefulness was heartwarming.

Several days later, when Madame Pauline was saying goodbye to us, she thanked us again for the kits, and said that one student reported she was already using the kit, and it was effective!

On the last day of our visit to Ghana, we attended a Soroptimist meeting in Accra (about 11 hours south of Damongo). Imagine our delight that one of SI Accra's main projects is creating Reusable Sanitary Pads (RSPs) for local girls. They have already made and distributed over 1,000 kits, which are quite similar to DfG!


Halloween-themed Basket for "Tears in Heaven"
