No Falling...

2 Kings 10:10—"Know then that there shall fall to the earth nothing of the Word of the Lord."

Yesterday afternoon, I heard a loud sound from outside of the church. I checked to see what it was and noticed that a few tree trimmers were cutting down a tree across the street. I couldn't tell how old it was, but the tree was big and tall. After a couple of strikes of an electric saw, it fell down to the ground in pieces.

Then I thought of the collapse of the Twin Towers in New York City. Groundbreaking for the two buildings took place in 1966, and was completed in 1970 and 1971, in lower Manhattan. The height of these enormous towers was 413m (1,355 ft.) to the very top. However, it took only seconds for the buildings to crumble into rubble and 2,750 lives went down with it. One of them was a good friend of mine from college. To this day I extend my condolences to those who lost their families.



In South Korea, the number one national treasure was also destroyed in 2008. It was called Namdaemun and was built in 1938. This historical gate, located in the heart of the capital, fell to pieces at the hands of an arsonist. It also took only a few seconds for this 600 year old national treasure to be demolished.

Whatever looks great, huge or beautiful was gone in a heartbeat. No matter how much we value or love the things built, or grown naturally, someday they will disappear into the history books and only remain as a faint memory.

Then what do we do? Should we not build anything on earth? Should we deny ourselves all those beautiful things? No, we shouldn't. But the question we should ask is **what our focus really is.** What matters is whether we follow what we externally see or feel, or whether we strive for the invisible truth behind those human senses. The Spirit of God deeply permeates through all human events, and fulfills the Lord's authoritative plan. His Word only, is everlasting. Only His power is permanent.

Some Facts About Menaul:

- The only mid and high school in Albuquerque with a resident student program, Menaul is a coeducational institution of education in grades 6-12, serving 360-370 students a year.
- It is fully accredited by the North Central Association of colleges and Secondary Schools and by the New Mexico Department of Education, and is one of nine racial ethnic schools and colleges nationwide supported by the PCUSA.
- It was established as a Presbyterian mission school in 1881 by Rev. Sheldon Jackson and reopened by Rev. James Menaul in 1896.
- Though now incorporated as a nonprofit organization with its own Board of Trustees, Menaul School maintains its Presbyterian relationship and mission through covenantal relationships with the General Assembly of the PCUSA, the presbytery of Santa Fe and the Synod of the Southwest.

In September, Phyllis Knoflicek mailed 276 Box Tops, 12 Bonus Box Tops and 1-20 Bonus Box Tops to Menaul School. Thanks to everyone for continuing to bring your Box Tops to the church. Note: The certificates on Campbell's Soup labels are no longer accepted for this program. Bos Tops bring 10 cents each to the school.




Does anyone know the whereabouts of the Church Register for the years 1944 through 1948? It is missing



Thoughts for the Journey—How We Worship...

THE WORSHIP OF GOD IS THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH AND CENTER OF OUR LIFE TOGETHER IN THE CHURCH. The Westminster Shorter Catechism affirms that our chief end in life is "to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." This places the worship of God at the very center of what it means to be God's people and makes worship the highest expression we can render to our God-given humanity. Christian worship is a corporate act of the people of God where we gather to realize God's presence and respond with praise to God's gift of love to us in Jesus Christ.

The next several months this column will focus individual acts of worship that take place each Sunday.

8. **THE GLORIA PATRI**—is sung in response to the good news that we, in Jesus Christ, stand forgiven.

THE PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S WORD

9. **THE PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION**—invites the presence of the Holy Spirit to bless us with the understanding of God's Word in Scripture.

10. **THE SCRIPTURE READINGS**—are central to this section of the service, which is drawn from the ancient synagogue service concerned primarily with the reading and preaching of God's Word. While the synagogue service consisted of readings from the Old Testament, readings from the New Testament were added as Christians began to develop their own scriptures. Most weeks at First Presbyterian Church will include a reading from each testament reflecting the biblical center of our worship.

Let's begin to approach our morning of worship as we enter the Sanctuary—directing our hearts and minds towards our gracious God in order to glorify Him and give ourselves totally to Him in praise and worship.
