It is possible that this might have been the Sunshine Company's first version, with Linda Kay Henning's voice stripped out and replaced by two female singers in the group. <i>CBS-TV's Petticoat Junction</i> sitcom series aired episodes from 1967 and 1968 in which the Bradley Sisters (the lineup of Linda Kaye Henning, Lori Saunders, and Meredith MacRae) perform the song, minus the second verse.
