his article was started on March 31. Since then Governor Kemp has issued a Shelter in Place for the state of Georgia and cancelled school for the remainder of this school year. Just one more obstacle to overcome. Good thing I learned in the Marine Corps that when you find an obstacle, step back reconnoiter and then figure out how to either go over it or around it so that's what we are doing.

What a tough time this is for everyone. Most states are telling us to Shelter in Place and if we are around others, stay six feet away. Can't even get a hug from anyone and that is why I joined the Lions.

Then we add to this the fact that at the Georgia Lions Camp we start camp on June 14 and have camp every week for the next five weeks. Consultants are working on their programs for their week and Camp Director Mike Williams is getting his staff together. Campers are starting to select their sessions but that's difficult with all the public schools being closed through April 24. This year we worked hard, listened to the suggestions from the Advisory Board and are adding to our programs.

Now we have to get that word to the potential campers. The vision teachers, TVI's, have been very good in the past about getting the word out and actually helping the students but school is closed through April 24. The Center For The Visually Impaired has an after school program that was also a source for campers but that program is closed until the fall.

More than ever before this now becomes a project for the Lions of Georgia to help find, contact and encourage campers to come to camp. That can be done through the camp website, through contact with people you know that are visually impaired or just mentioning to friends about our camp and maybe they know someone that would be a great camper. Everyone I, is not just sitting home watching TV their multitasking, watching TV, talking on the phone visiting with Skype or Zoom. Mention the Georgia Lions Camp and increase everyone's

There are also campers that cannot afford to pay the \$350 fee to attend camp and if they ride the bus from Macon, that's another \$75. Based on information received today, it appears that the United States may be able to restart at the end of May. If so, then camp can start on June 14 and we will be prepared. However we first need campers and then we need funds to help pay for them.
