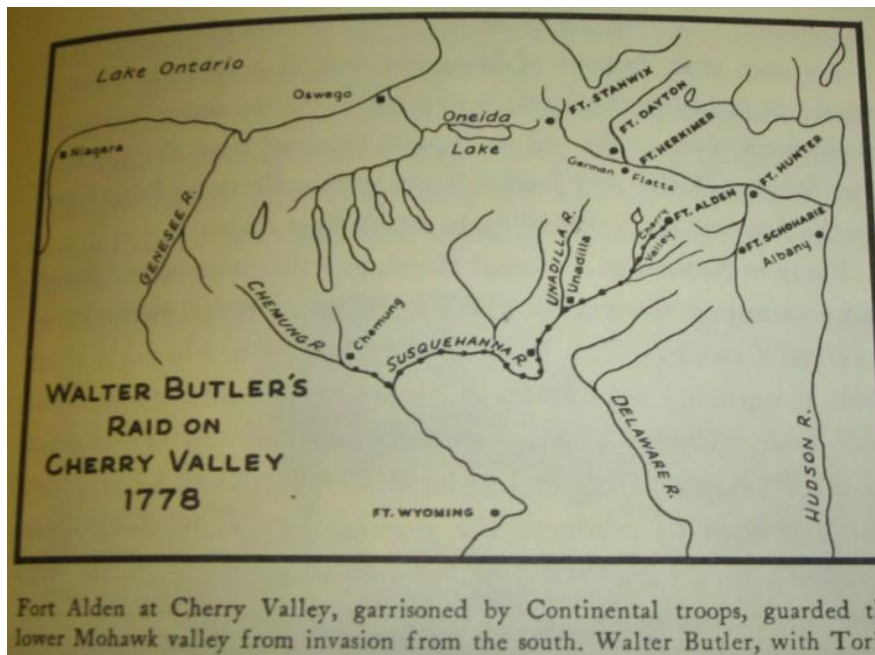

## **WHO WILL BE PRESENTING?**

**Christian Goodwillie** is director and curator of special collections at the Burke Library at Hamilton College in Clinton. He serves as Associate Editor of the Richard W. Couper Press. Previously he was Curator of Collections at Hancock Shaker Village 2001-2009 and has co-authored or edited ten books and numerous articles on the Shakers.

**Karen Cuccinello** currently serves as the town of Summit and village of Stamford historian in Schoharie and Delaware counties and has written numerous historical articles and books. She also does much genealogy research.

**Patrick Reynolds** is a graduate of the Cooperstown Museum program at SUNY Oneonta and has worked at the Ford Museum in Dearborn, MI, the Rome Historical Society, and the Chittenango Boat Landing Museum specializing in displays and exhibits. He is currently the Director of Public Programs at the Oneida County History Center.

**Jan DeAmicis** has retired from Utica College where he taught sociology for 30 years and helped found the Oneida County Freedom Trail Commission, that has installed four signs of Utica Underground Railroad sites. Currently he is involved with the Fort Stanwix study of Slavery, Abolitionism, and the Underground Railroad in pre-Civil War Oneida County.
