The Big 6-0 Was One for the Books

"I know what you're going to call it in your ASI Bulletin story 'One for the books!" said Gaycia Neubauer, Amana who lives on the corner near the Festhalle grounds and has a front run seat to Amana's biggest party. "It had to be one of the biggest ever!"

We haven't heard any numbers, but most would have to agree this was one grand fest. And it certainly was one of the hottest. Though two years ago we did top 92 degrees on Saturday, this year it was hot all four days of the festival run. On Friday at 3 p.m. it was 92 on Amana's Main Street with temps hovering in the high, 80s Saturday and Sunday during the day.

"But I'll take heat over rain any day," said Angela Bendorf Jamison, who drove 1,000 miles with her husband to be here with her family at Oktoberfest. Her Dad, Hank Bendorf was the first ever Oktoberfest chairperson. He brough the idea to the Amana Jaycee's (Junior Chamber) after he, his wife, Amber, his sister in law, Amber's sister and her husband visited, by sheer chance, the LaCrosse, WI festival.

A few highlights:

Kids and families certainly enjoyed the new Amana Colonies Playground in the village of Amana next to the Amana Woolen Mill complex. The playground has been in the works for a while, but with the help of volunteers and the Amana Society Forestry Department team, it was ready for kids to enjoy at Oktoberfest. It proved a popular spot for children all weekend long. Next to be added: seating and a sign.

Have we ever had this long a parade? Have we ever hosted this many area fire departments? We don't think so. We lost count at 12 big fire trucks and several smaller emergency vehicles here for the our 60th anniversary fest.

The parade winners: Best Use of Theme – the Amana Arts Guild; Most Humorous – Ackerman Winery, "Diamonds are Forever," float; and the Judge's Choice – the Clear Creek Amana High School Marching Band.

Well, Thursday night in the Festhalle proved pretty darn fun with lots of locals gathering, plus visitors from the Amana Colonies RV Park and overnight lodgers. "This is perfect as we check out Friday and head back to Chicago after supper Friday!" said one young couple who had only day to enjoy the festival. When they heard there would be entertainment on Thursday evening, they made sure to arrive by 6

p.m., check into their hotel and then go out to enjoy themselves Thursday evening.

The new Festhalle Ratzkeller (or whatever we are going to call it) was a hit. If you didn't see it, make a point to see it soon. This space is truly cool and with the shady, north side, apron of green grass and plenty of picnic tables, it's a lovely spot to enjoy the music which can be heard clearly from the Festhalle above. Remember this space with its functional bar is available to rent for graduation parties, family reunions and all sorts of events.

All the new entertainment was outstanding. We had the Polka Police, the Jolly Germans, the Ben Schmidt Band, the Happy Players and Alpine Thunder here at the festival and truly, it was four days of almost nonstop tunes and excellent music. Hats off to our Die Tiefen Keller Kinder who were honored for having members who have performed at all of our Oktoberfests and the Amana Colony Folk Singers and their Dancing Troupe. Their shows were exceptional this year.

Next week we'll write about all the festival honorees but we want to say now, that adding a moment to highlight and honor those who have contributed to our community has become an important Oktoberfest tradition.
