Back in the day, our PSL Botanical Garden was just a wish and a dream, held by a small committee of interested citizens and chaired by then-Council member, Christopher Cooper. The City took pride in the variety and number of public parks the City boasted, but many were devoted to athletic and youth groups. The nearest botanical garden was Heathcote in Fort Pierce. In Vero Beach, McGee Garden was a mecca for nature enthusiasts, and Mounts Botanical Garden in West Palm Beach, a county facility, was a learning opportunity for the public in proper horticulture.

All three of our sister botanical gardens offer plant sales to the public. The newly formed PSL Botanical Gardens committee started offering plant sales to the public before the Gardens became a reality, in 2007, in an effort to raise support for the Gardens idea, and to bring to the PSL public the opportunity to learn from the vendors themselves, all experts in their chosen 'plant of passion'.





Meet Joleen King

Geographically, Joleen King definitely has the best of both worlds!

Winters are spent in Port St. Lucie in a home in Kitching Cove in Sandigan, which she calls a "quiet, hidden gem" and summers on the beautiful island of Martha's Vineyard, which she has been visiting for more than 40 years.

A native of St. Paul, Minnesota, Joleen went to work at Ecolab, Inc. upon high school graduation and at the age of 21 transferred as an Executive Secretary from the home offices in St. Paul to the company's New York headquarters.

Her was the first (and last) transfer the company had ever done and it played her right into the "Mad West" years of 1971 New York!

In 1975 she married her now ex-husband Patrick and with him started a company called the U.S. Academy of Olympic Gymnastics, Inc., with locations in Greenwich and Norwich, Connecticut and a summer program in Martha's Vineyard.

The Academy offered the full gamut of gymnastic instruction from Olympic level women's and men's training (competition to early childhood movement education programs). The school was considered one of the top three gymnastics schools in the United States, with many students receiving college scholarships. The Kings sold the Academy in 1999.

During her summers in Martha's Vineyard, Joleen continues to work at the Vineyard Haven Yacht Club as Office Manager, allowing her to maintain long-term friendships.

and to keep her hand in sports education, management and youth activities.

She also is Program Administrator to the MVHC Summer Institute, a speaker program/ community outreach of the MV Hebrew Center, and is responsible for sponsor donation and solicitation, speaker travel and accommodations, venue logistics, etc. for the nationally-recognized speakers who appear each year.

One of Joleen's passions is gardening and she joined the Rio Lindo Garden Club of Port St. Lucie in 2000, where she's currently president.

This committed Florida Federation of Garden Clubs member and supporter feels the organizations are vastly underrated. They were responsible for the anti-litter campaigns of the 60's and were "green" before it became popular, she shares.

In the mid-2000s, Joleen was one of the interested people who got involved early on and helped bring about the eventual reality

of a local botanical garden: the Port St Lucie Botanical Gardens, located on Westmoreland Boulevard.

Over the years, Joleen has served on the Board of the Friends of the Port St Lucie Botanical Gardens, Inc. and is currently president.

With homes in Connecticut, Massachusetts and Florida, she's had ample opportunity to perfect her skills and became a St. Lucie County Master Gardener in 2011,

Joleen is the proud mom of a fur baby Tess, a Multi-poo "terror" and warns "Don't get between her and her food bowl!"

As busy as her life is, at the end of each summer Joleen is thrilled to return to the home in Kitching Cove which she's lived in and loved since 1984.

With only sixteen home sites, the residences are uniquely designed. Neighbors know their neighbors. The annual meeting is traditionally a pot luck dinner, out in the

middle of a cul de sac (weather permitting!).

Because of their busy work schedules, Joleen and her ex-husband would occasionally rent out their Treasure Coast residence.

In 1987, the renter was the Thomas J. White Corporation, which was in the process of planning the future of St. Lucie West. Much of the design of that community was finalized around her dining room table!

Joleen has already started to think about where in the world she wants to travel for her 70th birthday in 2020.

With a tradition of spending the 'important' birthdays around something older than she is, she'll have to put on her thinking cap to top the 40th birthday at Stonehenge, the 50th on a sailing adventure and the 60th at the Pantheon in Rome.

There's no doubt she'll come up with someplace fascinating and unique - just like she is!

What to Plant

Annuals/Bedding plants: Good performers in South Florida's mild winter include impatiens, verbena, dianthus, strawflower, and lobelia. **See Annuals:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_annual_landscape_plants

Bulbs: Many bulbs can be planted now. Divide large, crowded clumps. Provide adequate water for establishment. Some examples include Amazon lily, crinum, and agapanthus. **See Bulbs for Florida:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_bulbous_flowers

Groundcovers: Consider replacing areas of grass with drought-tolerant, low-maintenance groundcovers. **See *The Florida-Friendly Landscaping™ Guide to Plant Selection and Landscape Design*:** http://fyn.ifas.ufl.edu/pdf/FYN_Plant_Selection_Guide_v090110.pdf and **Ground Covers:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_ground_covers

Vegetables: Winter vegetable gardening is in full swing. Last month to plant cantaloupes, cucumbers, eggplant, lettuce, peppers, spinach, and tomatoes for a late spring harvest. Protect crops in the unlikely event of a frost or freeze. **See Vegetable Gardening in Florida:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_vegetable_gardening

What to Do

Lawns: Fertilize lawn grasses to improve color or coverage. Choose a fertilizer (not a "weed and feed") with no or very little phosphorus unless a soil test indicates the need for it. A fertilizer with controlled-release nitrogen provides longer-lasting results. **See Lawn Fertilizer:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_lawn_fertilization

Roses: Prune roses this month to remove damaged canes and improve the overall form. After pruning, fertilize and apply a fresh layer of mulch. Blooming will begin 8–9 weeks after pruning. **See Roses:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_rose

Shrubs and palms: Fertilize shrubs and palms by spreading fertilizer evenly over the soil surface and watering it in. Follow with a fresh layer of mulch to conserve moisture and reduce weeds. Delay pruning any cold-damaged branches until new growth starts. **See Palm Nutrition and Fertilization:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_palm_nutrition and **Landscape Fertilization:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_landscape_fertilization

Lawns: Apply a preemergence weed killer (not a "weed and feed") to lawns late this month to prevent germination of warm-season weed seeds. Apply when temperatures rise to 65°F for 4–5 days. Timing is important for good control. **See Lawn Weeds:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_lawn_weeds

Avocados and mangos: Disease-susceptible varieties of avocado and mango may require applications of copper fungicide. **See Avocado:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_avocado and **Mango:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_mango

Citrus: Fertilize now if not done in January. Frequency and amount of fertilization depend on the age of the tree. **See Home Citrus Culture:** http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_citrus_home_citrus_culture


