There are a number of ways that Members and Units can promote scholarships:

- Assign a member to communicate with school guidance counselors/teachers regarding scholarship applications. Make copies of the applications (found at www.ALAforVeterans.org/Scholarships) and provide them to the schools.
- Inform school-aged children in your community about National, Department and Unit scholarship opportunities.
- Volunteer to be on the scholarship selection committee in your District or Unit.
- Make a donation to American Legion Auxiliary education scholarship funds (Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship, ALA Foundation at www.ALAFoundation.org or Department, District or Unit scholarships).
- Create a Unit scholarship fund to award scholarships to local students.
- Prepare a news release with scholarship information for local media and your Post/Unit newsletter.
- Publicize the winners of Auxiliary scholarships at a school presentation and through the media.

National American Legion Auxiliary scholarships awarded in each Division include the Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship, the Non-Traditional Student Scholarship, the Spirit of Youth Scholarship and the Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship. The Department of Arizona also awards the Wilma Hoyal-Maxine Chilton Memorial Scholarship to a second-year or upper division student in Political Science, Public Programs or Special Education at Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University or the University of Arizona.

Form 990-N filers will use a new sign-in process beginning this summer

Beginning August 2022, smaller charities that are eligible and choose to file Form 990-N, Electronic Notice for Tax-Exempt Organizations (e-Postcard), must sign into the IRS modernized authentication platform using either their active IRS username or create an account with ID.me, the current IRS credential service provider. When accessing the Form 990-N submission page, Form 990-N filers have three options:

- Sign in with their active IRS username: Users with an active IRS username have the option to access the Form 990-N submission page using their existing IRS credentials or they can choose to create a new account with ID.me.
- Sign in with their existing ID.me account: Users that have an ID.me account to access other IRS online services or from a state or federal agency can sign in using their existing ID.me account.
- Create a new ID.me account: Users that don't have an active IRS username credential must register and sign in with ID.me.

ID.me account creation requires an email address and multifactor authentication. Form 990-N filers who have an existing IRS username and register for an ID.me account must use the same email address.

For Form 990-N filing instructions, see <u>Publication 5248 PDF</u>, Form 990-N Electronic Filing System User Guide.

The filing process has not changed for organizations that file <u>Form 990</u>, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, or <u>Form 990-EZ</u>, Short Form Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax.

School assignments were changed in some cases to accommodate new high schools. Many of the established things are still required but we also have new ways to promote the program that were learned from our virtual experiences and last year's program.

We look forward to seeing you at the Girls State meeting on Saturday November 5th. The who...what...where...and why of Girls State will be addressed through information you will receive and then through questions and answers.

The Unit should regard its connection with the Post as a distinct honor. It should strive unceasingly to carry out the National Constitution's pledge "to participate in and contribute to the accomplishment of the aims and purposes of The American Legion."

Some history on Miss Poppy.

Several years ago I was Dept. Poppy Chairmen. The answer to the most interesting question I received is worth repeating. The person(s) that responded to my inquiry held the position(s) mentioned in 2018. The question was: How did Miss Poppy originate? What a great question it was. I researched it, found nothing. I sent the question to the Western Division Poppy Chairman at that time. It was forwarded until it reached Cathi M. Taylor /Archivist and Data Projects Coordinator / ALA Nat'l headquarters.

The following is what Cathi M. Taylor wrote in response:

It seems that the first Miss Poppy contest, at the national level, was held in 1959. In the annual report made by the chairman of the Poppy Committee for 1958-1959, Alberta Mackey, she states "It was generally agreed that the best publicity received was contributable to the "Miss Poppy" on television, and to the new "Miss Poppy" contest! The newness and simple appeal generated an enthusiasm not seen before in many Units. This Committee is deeply indebted to Mrs. Ruth Critz, her Committee, Mr. Layton Hurst, Radio-TV Director, and Miss Mildred Collins, National Public Relations Counsel for originating this marvelous idea, and for the remarkable accomplishments in the field of Poppy publicity this year." I have not found a resolution for this contest so I am not sure how this was started.

Also, Mrs. Paul F. Critz stated at the 1959 national convention: "To stimulate interest in Poppy Day and provide new ideas for publicity, a contest was initiated for "Miss Junior Poppy of 1959" in cooperation with the National Poppy Committee. Entries were received from thirty Departments. Statements and clippings sent with the entries indicated that very effective use was made of the "Miss Poppies" and that the resulting radio, television and newspaper publicity aided Poppy Days. "Miss Poppies" presented the first poppy to the mayor in many cities.

That being said, Past National President Leta Zeller (1956-1957) had her granddaughter provide then US President Eisenhower with a poppy. I have found reference to Miss Poppy contests being held in New Jersey in the 1950's prior to 1959, as well as in Colorado. However, these appear to be joint ventures with the VFW.

It could be that the Legion and Auxiliary determined to hold their own contest instead of it being a joint effort with the VFW. This is conjecture on my part. (end)

Hope you enjoyed this as I thought it was fascinating.

I strongly encourage each Unit to have a Miss Poppy if possible. These girls have so much fun, they feel important to be an active part of something that you, the adults, are involved in. TIPS FOR SOCIAL MEDIA BEST PRACTICES

It's important to efficiently utilize social media to share the ALA's message of who we are, what we do, and why we matter.

Here are a few general best practices for social media when posting about the American Legion Auxiliary on pages the public sees, such as your unit/district/ department pages:

Think before you post

Use common sense. Think twice before posting something that may hurt the image of the American Legion Auxiliary or compromise your privacy, and never post confidential or proprietary information. Be aware that courts may judge certain material as proprietary, copyrighted, defamatory, libelous, or obscene.

Start talking ... er, posting

Social media is meant to be social — think of it as an ongoing conversation. Engage with others by including a call to action such as sharing, retweeting, liking, or commenting on your posts to encourage social sharing. Comment where appropriate to keep the conversation going.

Know the etiquette

Ever get an email written in uppercase letters and find yourself taken aback? In social media, there are also cultural norms, expectations, and conventions that govern user interactions. Failure to observe them may compromise your credibility or make you come across as a negative person when that never may have been your intention.

Get the ALA out there

Talk about the American Legion Auxiliary, our programs, volunteers projects, and mission. Share examples of activities going on in your unit or department, keep your content fresh, and update it often.

Graphics help get you noticed

Your followers see a lot of text when they sign in to Facebook or Twitter — you want to stand out! Research has shown that using visuals such as photos and videos with social media posts greatly increases engagement. See what software is available online — apps like Canva offer free, attractive templates to design, collaborate, and share on social media.

Celebrate!

Share good news, celebrate milestones, congratulate members, and post other happy occasions. Audiences want to celebrate your victories with you, no matter how small.

All events are suspended until further notice. There is communication that some volunteer activities will be restarting. No specifics as of this date. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Second booster shots (fourth shot) are also now available for those over 50.

Southwest Blind Rehabilitation Center is now open and is resuming outings. Visitation at SAVAHCS is still limited. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time.

There is a new program to assist Veterans patients with food insecurities. A separate food pantry is filling this need. Thank you to Unit 132 for their generous donation to this program. Thank you to Auxiliary Unit 131 who donated \$1,000 to benefit this program. We had a lot of fun purchasing and delivering the food items.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022 is \$6,595.00. Thank you to Units 66 & 131 for their generous donations. Through their help, we were able to support the Wheelchair Games, the Community Gardens program and the Gathering of American Indian Veterans program.
