# From the Hearts & Hands of Session

As Puckety Church we *Honor God*:

The leaders of Puckety Church would like every one of you to be praying for us – all of us. On August 12th we will have our annual Joint Board meeting (where the Elders & Deacons join over a picnic for a kind of "big picture" discussion). For all our active Elders & Deacons ... we are asked to intentionally prepare for this time to discuss, dream, and discern. If you're serving on one of the boards we ask you to come with prayer-sought observations and ideas – both: 1) to be honest and grateful of how we have fulfilled our mission in the last year – to thank God and to learn – as well as 2) to offer specific ideas and concrete ways to - "honor God," "grow in faith," and "improve our community and world in the coming year. For example, instead of saying something general like, "Well, we need to get more of our other members to join in our ministries," think of actionable and realistic ways we could motivate others, both by leading ourselves and by inspiring in other ways. Yes, we "need more help" but let's creatively open ourselves to the Spirit so we don't rely on vague hopes. Let's come, having sought the Spirit individually beforehand, ready to be receptive to the Spirit's guidance in each other, as a whole.

#### As Puckety Church, we **Grow in Faith**:

August is the month when we plan for our fall discipleship – individually and in groups. So ... how do you plan to grow in faith starting in September? Will you be joining one of our 4 adult small groups? If you find that they don't meet at a time that will work for your schedule or the curriculum isn't applicable for you, would you consider reaching out to some other members who may be in the same position and facilitate a different small group? [The Church has funds and resources to help you!] If weekdays and evenings won't work for you, perhaps you could help our Children's Church teachers by joining their team; they would love some extra help (even if it's just once or twice a month) and it's just around the corner! Finally, since growing in faith is obviously more than learning with our minds, what ways are you exploring to put the truth "into action"? Maybe you can help with the Meals 4 Children ministry to our school kids (see Matt Wehrle or Pastor Brian). Maybe help with Origins/TryLife (see Wiebke Kilbert). There's a new opportunity called the Family Promise House in Brackenridge – they could use someone to cook a meal for several families (15 or so people) about 4 times a year (or there are other ways to help). We also grow in faith when we put what we've learned to good use in service. Truth isn't complete until it is expressed in love. Let's grow in the Lord by serving our neighbor.

# As Puckety Church, we Improve our Community & World:

In lieu of a normal stated meeting, on July 8th, the members of Session went as the work team *Origins Family Center* (formerly TryLife). We split up into two teams – half working inside with folding, consolidating, organizing clothes, etc. and the other half working outside (in the considerable heat) for the 5-8:00pm timeframe in clearing overgrowth, sawing up a fallen tree and removing,

repairing stairs on the outside deck – Mick, Matt, and I were soaked with sweat by the end, but grateful to be of help. Afterward, the back part of their parking lot was not only cleaner and clearer, but safer too. We even "uncovered" the hidden AC unit from the "bamboo-like" shrubbery that was blocking the side of the building. My many thanks to the men and women who gave of their time to support our community partner!

We encourage our members to please take advantage of either signing up (hallway) for one of the monthly teams for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the year, and/or to donate to the "OTC" (over-the-counter) box, which will be put back in the hallway starting in August for in-demand products for the families who come to Origins. #### A Devotional for You - Read James 1:2-4, & 12

After an extensive tour of the U.S., the German theologian Helmut Thielicke was asked what he saw as the greatest defect among American Christians. He replied, "They have an inadequate view of suffering." There have been times I've agreed with him. "Why does God let such hard things happen?" This has been a season where this question has been asked in various ways (it's always out there, but recently it seems more vocalized) – particularly when crises like the war b/n Russia and Ukraine, the deadly flooding in Texas, and the destructive wildfires around Grand Canyon NP (did you know that the Kerr County flooding and the Dragon Bravo Fire that started in the North Rim BOTH happened on July 4<sup>th</sup>?!). The amount of cries with the word, "Why?" in them were in the millions that day alone.

On the one hand, it's a question that has been considered by over a 100 books in the last 300 years – some of those books being over 1,000 pages long (I haven't made it through those ones quite yet). But that being said, I'm not going to answer in a page and a half what they haven't done (satisfactorily) in centuries. After this, people will still say, "I can't believe in a God who would allow Auschwitz, COVID, and the starvation in Gaza." But I do want to try to give an insight to accompany the question.

For those in the Reformed tradition (and going back to the ancient Church Fathers), Christian believers have said that even when "evil" things happen, God uses them according to his purpose – i.e., for his glory. I know, I know, that doesn't satisfy either. That's a platitude. What we need is a window, or a "lens" to see through. God gave us one. The cross. No matter how bad the things that happen are, someone could trace the train of "wreckage" back to our own human sin. But in Christ's death, where evil was done to one who was truly innocent, truly just, and fully good ... "Why?" None of the disciples saw why at the time. But on the "other side" of the resurrection – a real and tangible event – we see "why" – God used not just good, but the bad to bring about something even better, something more beautiful, and something WAY MORE lasting than the hurt. This is our lens to see through.

In a way, I see it as the two lenses in a pair of glasses, or a kind of "bifocal" lens. With one half, God uses pain because it sometimes is the only way to "get our attention" when we have chosen sin and evil. If you look at the accounts of the Bible and the course of history, without something, well, *horrible*, it would lead to something worse. What can God use to speak loudly enough so we'll pay attention? What will convince us – when we're so focused on earthly things – that this world is not running the way God's creation is supposed to run? That the human condition is out of whack. But that's just "one side" of the lenses. The other side is how God uses even our pain for our good. Both halves of the lenses are in full effect at the cross. We don't see everything yet, but we know God has acted in an indescribably loving and merciful way.

What is God trying to tell us? And in addition, I leave you with one more question, for you to ask alongside the painful and honest questions: "Is it possible that God is using this to make me more like his Son; to conform me to the image of Him, who 'was made perfect through suffering' (Hebrews 2:10)? So, if Jesus wasn't exempt, what right do we have to say that we do? And more than that, consider this as I believe this is what the Bible teaches – there is a kind of honor given to us, when we suffer and yet believe in the goodness of the Father, as Christ did (Acts 5:40-41). I'll end with a quote from Philip Yancey in *Where is God When It Hurts* (still a great book): "With specific trials and torments, it may be dangerous and unscriptural to torture ourselves by looking for his message in the throbs of daily life ... But from the larger view, from the view of all history, God is speaking to us through pain – or at least in spite of pain. He can use it to make us aware of Him (when other attempts do not suffice). The symphony He is working out includes minor chords, dissonance, and tiring fugal passages. But those of us who follow His conducting through these early movements will, with renewed strength, someday burst into song."

Prayer Mailbox Need a prayer? First Presbyterian can help!

First Presbyterian Church of Avonmore has been blessed with a totally new unique outreach. Commissioned Pastor Lynn Mance shared an idea and member Bill Frain self-designed a beautifully handmade church prayer mailbox and made it a reality. It is made of wood and has a metal roof. The cross on the steeple is very special. Not only is it Jesus' cross it is made from shittim wood. Shittim wood grows along the banks of the Jordan River in Israel. In the Book of Exodus, God commanded the Israelites to make the Ark of Covenant and parts of the Tabernacle out of shittim wood. The

mailbox is placed in the front of the church accessible to the lower parking lot and sidewalk. Inside is a tablet, envelopes and opens to leave a personal prayer. The prayers will be collected and shared within the Sunday worship congregational prayers and then in personal prayers.

On Sunday June 1 members prayed over the mailbox to give it God's blessings to the community. Prayers of the community are welcome. The congregation is excited to see what God can do thorough this mailbox.
