

EARLY SLOGANS

<u>1903 - 1905</u>
"Aids Digestion"

Pepsi-Cola, first manufactured with a digestive aid called pepsin, was first advertised as a treatment for stomach disorders. "Pepsi-Cola -- Exhilarating, Invigorating, Aids Digestion" read the first Pepsi-Cola newspaper advertisement on February 25, 1903 in the New Bern (NC) Daily Journal.

1906 - 1939
"Delicious and Healthful"

By 1906, Pepsi-Cola founder Caleb Bradham developed a slogan for his new drink that would last for more than three decades: Delicious and Healthful. In 1909, Bradham fired the company's first advertising agency, Biggs, Young, Shone & Company. They foucused on the invigorating beverage with ads like:

YOU CAN WORK BETTER
in warm weather by drinking
delicious Pepsi-Cola
during business hours. Wonderfully
refreshing -- overcomes fatigue and
exhaustion. Keep it in the office and
it will keep you fit for work. Guaranteed
under the Pure Food Law.




1940 BOTTLE







1970'S NORMAN ROCKWELL SANTA




1955 DISPLAY RACK

COLLECTORS SPOTLIGHT

In this issue of Collectors Spotlight we feature Rick Russell of Gardena, California.

My interest in Pepsi as a hobby started quite innocently about a dozen or so years back. One day, while shopping I ran across a 50's style bottle at my local market, it was like finding an old friend. So, after relishing it's contents, the empty bottle took a place of Honor on a shelf in my living room. That small step has since grown to fill two rooms and infringe on a couple more.

I find now, my fondness leans toward the earlier pieces, although I have acquired several mini-collections of interest. Such as, forty different bottle openers (the earliest dated 1901), seventy assorted matchbook covers (including one from Peru circa 1940), forty Commemorative bottles, and about one hundred items representing 15 foreign countries (including Russia).

As for Double-Dot, I recently obtained a near-mint 1932 12 ounce for 10¢ cardboard sign (dropped to 5¢ in 1933). I have also found a Pepsi-Cola "Special Officer" badge from Norfolk, Virginia, circa late 30's I believe. Does anyone have more information on this? If so please write. Also some "Pepsi Pete" such as: a die cut Fan Pull, a 21" x 3½" Tin, and a stand up bottle display, among others. I would like to mention my Pepsi Truck, a 1930 Dodge "C" cab refurbished as a delivery of that era.

At present I have over 500 items displayed, ranging from tokens embossed with the early (1930 style) logo, to my own stock certificate for two shares of PepsiCo, a gift from my wife.

Since the first P.C.C.C. meeting held here in Nov. 1983, with four collectors present, to a membership of over 100 in the first year, may I say Hello to those I have met, and Welcome to those I haven't as yet. In closing I would like to extend an invitation to members visiting the Los Angeles/South Bay area, to drop by and take the tour. 
Doug Cline has announced he will be selling his collection sometime next year, see the classified for more information.

In this issue of the Collectors Spotlight we feature Teri Lunt of Modesto California.

I would assume all collectors start by being a real good Pepsi drinker? My family and close friends give me Pepsi items for Christmas and birthdays. My banker gave me a blue ice chest radio and my son gave me a tall late 30's Pepsi sign for Christmas 1978. The sign was rusty and in what I would call poor condition so I hid it. Around October 1982 I displayed this horrid looking sign with pride. This is the time I became an agrgressive collector instead of by chance. Initially I would not pay anymore than 10.00 for a Pepsi item. (sound familiar).

I joined the Pepsi Cola Collectors Club March of 84. In April I visited Bob Stoddard and Tom Avery in August. These visits let me see that there was many beautiful items available that I did not realize even existed. My collection has expanded to around 800 items consisting of 72 different bottles prior to 1950, 30 different commemorative bottles, and 20 some odd signs.

Pete sign 3½"x21", a heavy paste board double sign pay cashier 1940's?, a 1908
tip tray, 1939 anniversary book......forget it I guess they are all my favorites!
I enjoy visiting with anyone and talking about Pepsi collections. I owe many
thanks to Mr. Tom Avery for his help and encouragement.


CATCH THAT PEPSI SPIRIT
