DDA SELECTS NEW OFFICERS

Nominations were open for the offices of President, Vice-President and 6 Board of Trustee seats.

Nominees were as follows:

President - Dennis Haws;

Vice-President - Dave Fundis, Paul Trecziak, Hank Duff

Board of Trustees - John Miller, Rick Davis, John Ellithorp, Chris Sanders, Bob Hurt, Paul Cooper, Randy Pickrell, Mike Coogan, Jim Davis, Lynn Woolf and David Sears.

Dennis ran un-opposed and is the new President for two years. Hank Duff very narrowly defeated Dave Fundis to become our Vice-President, and the six Board of Trustee seats were won quite handily by Mike Coogan, Lynn Woolf, Paul Cooper, Bob Hurt, Chris Sanders and Rick Davis.

Voting was also done in order to change some of the DDA's by-laws. Item one concerned wording of the members in that "2/3 of present" for voting rather than "2/3 membership". (Passed 75-5) Item two stated that a financial report be printed in each newsletter. (Passed 71-9) Item three concerned Presidential duties. An article in the April newsletter covered these responsibilities with the following changes:

1-President's term is for two years being elected in odd numbered years
2-President can be replaced by a 2/3 vote of general membership during his/her term with a 30 day notice of voting. (Passed 76-9)
Item four consisted of the

Vice-President's responsibilities, also stated in the April newsletter with the following change - elected in opposing years to President and term also for two years starting in 1986. (Passed 78-3) Item five concerns the Secretary's duties as explained in the April newsletter. (Passed 76-9) Item six intailed responsibilities of the Treasurer once again explained in the previous newsletter. (Passed 76-4) Item seven explained the responsibilities of the board members. (Refer April newsletter. Passed 76-4) Item eight stated that the DDA would maintain a \$100.00 balance with outstanding debts included. (Passed 73-5) Items nine and ten were voted on as advice only to the Board of Directors. Nine was a vote to change to the 27 point scoring system. The vote was 57-27. Item ten was a vote, as advice only, to change the Gem and possibly the Gold divisions to the "Pro" system of play. (monies paid back). Not recommended by a vote of 29 for and 33 against.

A completed copy of the DDA by-laws should be available by the July board meeting. Parties interested in an exact reading or copy of the by-laws should contact Denny Haws ample time before said meeting.

The offices of Secretary, Treasurer, ADO representative and Sgt. at Arms are appointed positions in our association and need qualified people to fill these. Please contact Denny Haws at 254-7995 immediately if you are interested in filling one of these positions.

The first objective I want to accomplish is to operate a smooth running league. That is to see that scheduling and the day to day running of this league is planned as well as possible without unnecessary problems.





SUPER LEAGUE DARTS

Hello Dayton! I've been asked by Ted Borgert to write an occasional article about darts over here in England. But first I'd like to say hello to a few friends. I expect replies from most of the following people: Dave "Lean Machine" Bennis, Ron "Really Cocky" Cloutier, Bill "Mr. Darts" Nicoll Sr., Steve "To the Point" Smith, Ed "45 Machine" Conduff, all the heavers, breathers and all members of the D.D.A.

So what could be the difference between league darts in Dayton and Super League here in Cambridge? Well, to begin with, the pubs open around 7:00 pm and close at 10:30-11:00 pm. That makes for a very limited number of games available. Most pubs have only 1 dart board and you could wait 45 minutes for a game! 1 game of 501. The top darters in Dayton probably could manage to hold the board for an hour or so before they lost a game. I've been talking about non-league nights.

On league night they only play singles. The Super League is one step below the county and it's quite a privilege to play for and represent your county. Anyway, there are 10 singles matches, and that's all that's played. Everyone plays on 1 board so the other players sit and cheer on their teammate who happen to be playing at the time.

The main reasons for this singles format are numerous. First of all, a per dart average is recorded for that weeks' match and that average is accumulated during the course of the season. This lets the county selectors (a panel of 4-5 men) see how certain individuals fare in singles play. Another reason is stage experience, to see how players respond to playing in front of an audience. It really is a good feeling to have your friends sitting back, enjoying their beer, and it's an invaluable source of experience as far as "stage" experience which is something

you'll wish you had when you're in the finals of one of those tournaments back home.

Now, let's talk about beer! (Hic!) It's great! I've never tasted so many great and flavorful types of beer. There's lager, bitter, and Bill Nicoll's favorite cider! This is made from apples, it's stronger than beer and gives you a heck of a headache! Ouch!

Now, to finish my letter, I'd like to say a few words about blind draw tournaments here...What's that?! They're virtually nonexistent. These people are extremely poor or tight fisted. Most won't even play for a pint of beer. Well anyway, don't be strangers. Stay in touch.

It has become apparent that some players feel they may play on two different teams during dart season - Wed. & Thurs. It has been conveyed to me that their feelings are that these are two different leagues. This is not so! Both nights of league play are of the same league. Thursday was our original night of play until the novice divisions were formed several seasons ago and their play was on Wednesday. We have very few novice teams in our league now so due to the rather large number of teams making up the DDA (113 this year) we continued with Wednesday

play to accommodate those teams wishing to play on this night of the week. With most of our sponsoring taverns playing the maximum number of teams allowed it becomes almost impossible to allow this practice of playing on two teams. If an extreme number of players would continue this it is possible that either one or both nights would then again over-fill. 
