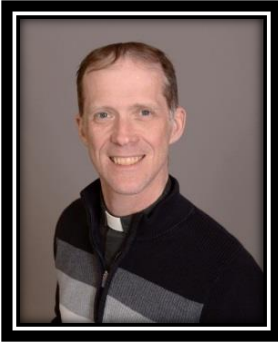

## Receiving God's Wisdom in Jesus --- -----With Pastor Eric

***<sup>22</sup>For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, <sup>23</sup>but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, <sup>24</sup>but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. <sup>25</sup>For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.***

*– I Corinthians 1:22-25*

I've heard that "certainty" is the opposite of faith. Sounds weird to write that idea down. If we were to make a list of things that we are certain about then the list might be surprisingly small and if pressed...uncertain. Faith is a gift that shines in the face of uncertainty because it allows us to extend ourselves while also acknowledge what we know and don't know. Instead of "certainty" I prefer the word "wisdom" which is a combination of experience, intuition and knowledge. I pray for God's wisdom quite often because I believe it calls for God's active presence and great humility. I think that wisdom helps to "work smarter and not harder" in a way that might seem counter intuitive.

We have walked through Lent reflecting and gleaning the wisdom of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's gospel. Jesus took the law and the prophets and taught the wisdom behind them which we might call principles of application, or the "So what?" in a sermon, and that wisdom did not seem like wisdom – according to the world that is. Jesus did not stop with this sermon! He shared his wisdom with us even on the cross upon which he suffered and died! We examined this wisdom through the "words that last forever" theme on Sundays. Each word from Jesus amid suffering has wisdom for us who suffer and die in how to respond and faithfully move through such times with the promise of Easter on the other side.

Now in April we are entering “Holy Week” with a new ear and eye for God’s wisdom in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Martin Luther had insight into the death of Jesus which he called the “*Deus absconditus*” Latin translates into “Hidden God.” He believed that on the cross of Jesus, God is the closest to us! So close that God seems hidden! If this is true, then there is great love, mystery, faith and wisdom to be received and experienced in other such moments in our life this side of heaven.

***Let us pray. Heavenly Father, author of wisdom, may we enter this Lent journey and Holy Week with hearts and minds attuned to your wisdom and deep love, so that we might receive sustenance and grow into the people whom you created us to be for you and one another in Jesus’s name. Amen.***

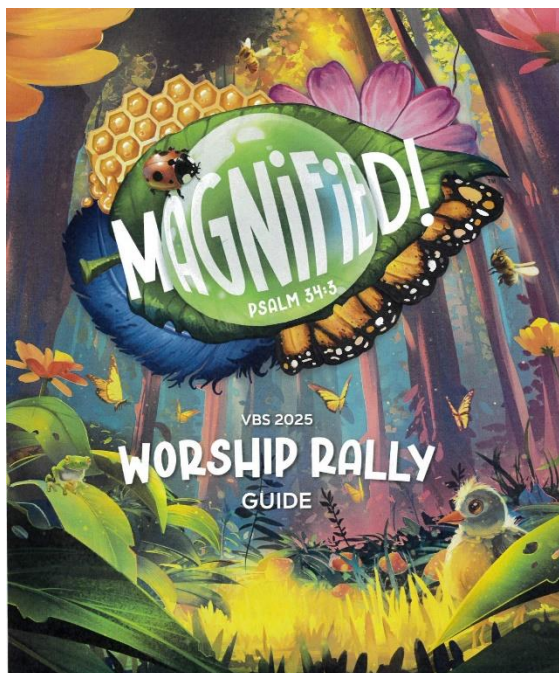

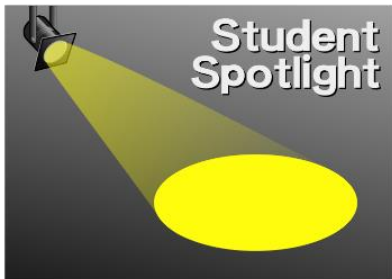

## April 2025 LSI Story

*LSI serves Iowans of all ages; from families with newborns navigating parenthood, to Refugee and Immigrant elders, and children of all ages. One of the most vital populations LSI supports is young parents, especially those navigating the challenges of early motherhood. Cheyenne F., a Family Support Specialist for LSI's Healthy Families America (HOPES) program, shares the impactful work she's doing with young mothers in need of support.*

She shares that she had the privilege of working closely with NF, a young mom who has shown incredible growth and resilience.

The Healthy Families America (HOPES) program is an evidence-based child abuse prevention program that provides support to prenatal families and families with children ages 0-5. LSI's Family Support Specialists work with families like NF's to provide the guidance and resources needed to break cycles of abuse and neglect and build strong, healthy foundations for children and parents alike.

NF's journey began in June 2023 when she reached out for help. At 19 years old and pregnant, NF was living in Muscatine County and knew she needed extra parenting support. Through the HOPES program, Cheyenne began building rapport with NF right away and learned about NF's challenging upbringing, which included bouncing from foster home to foster home starting at age 6.

**"NF had faced so much inconsistency and pain in her early years,"** shared Cheyenne. **"It was clear that she had a lot of unresolved trauma, but it was equally clear that she wanted to make a positive change in her life, especially for her baby."**

Throughout the course of their work together, Cheyenne and NF focused on building trust and creating a safe space for NF to share her experiences and challenges. NF revealed that after High School, she fell into a pattern of poor choices, including run-ins with the law. NF got pregnant, and although she knew the father, he didn't want to be involved in her pregnancy or her life. Despite this, she had two strong support networks: her foster parents and her current roommate.

Cheyenne shares that NF struggled with controlling her behavior, and she feared she might end up back in jail, which unfortunately happened. When she was incarcerated, Cheyenne made sure to stay in contact with her foster parents and provided them with regular updates and support.

When NF was released from jail, she confided in Cheyenne that she was considering running away with her baby, which prompted Cheyenne to share valuable resources with her to support her mental health, housing, and employment.

**“I knew that if NF ran, it could jeopardize the progress we had made. But with the right guidance and resources, NF began to see a different path forward,”** Cheyenne shared.

Cheyenne expressed her excitement about NF’s progress stating, **“NF has made such huge strides. She started attending therapy twice a week and has also found a job at a local consignment store. She’s enrolled in anger management classes and is committed to creating a better future for herself and her baby.”**

Today, NF’s baby is thriving, meeting all developmental milestones. NF continues to meet regularly with Cheyenne and enjoys engaging in evidence-based activities that are tailored to her needs as a young mother. **“I’m so thankful for the HOPES program. I don’t know where I’d be without the support of Cheyenne,”** NF shared.

It’s stories like NF’s that remind us why the work we do is so important. With the right support, anything is possible.
