I did not have my scale with me, so I could not weight it. Around 1am, I hooked a second one. It was a fighter also. After a couple of minutes, It snapped my line. Oh well. We kept on going until 6am with no luck. Sorry Sam with not even 1 nibble.

Cabo San Lucas Trip By Nick Dominguez

My dad Oscar Dominguez and I went out Fishing in Cabo San Lucas on the 22' Panga "Samantha". We left the marina about 6:45 and picked up some live bait. We had to go out about one mile before we could start trolling. We trolled a few miles down the coast with not much luck other than some bait sized skip jack. We got to a spot where the water was perfectly clear and we had some rock to the right of us. Caption José said that this was a Rooster Fish spot. So he rigged up my pole with just a hook and a live bait. All I did was fly line it out and let the fish free swim. I let the fish swim for a good 15-20 minutes. And let out about 200 yards of line. I felt the line start to go out of the spool a little faster. So I just tightened my grip. But it kept going, so I had to think about what Caption José told me. I let the fish run with it for 8 seconds then closed the spool and set the hook. I was reeling and felt a little resistance. But not much. I reeled for a good 5 minutes and then I felt nothing. I figured i lost the fish, "oh well, it felt small anyways." So I just kept cranking to get my hook in to put a new bait. I get the line about 30-40 yards from the boat and it takes off like a rocket. All I remember saying was "oh s**t, I've got a fish". This fish just kept running. I would get 10 feet back and he would take 50. I just inch by inch got it just a little closer. At about minute 20 I got it up enough where all saw some color. But as soon as he saw the boat he went 300 feet right back down. I fought it for another 10 minutes until I finally got it up forward the boat again. This time I was in control and it was not going any where. It started going on the other side of the motor so I followed it but lost my balance and accidentally released the Spool. The line went slack and I thought I lost it. I closed it back up and cranked as hard as I could. "Thank you Jesus, the fish is still there." It was not until I got it really close to the boat did I realize just how big this fish was. It took me about 30 minutes to reel this fish in, and it came out on the scale at 65 lbs. This was supposed to be day one of a two day fishing trip. But a storm rolled in so we could not go out for day two. But in the end it was all okay, I caught my first Rooster Fish. I have caught Dorado before so it was nice to catch something new.

July 15th Pursuit By Alex Perez

I had been wanting to go fishing for a long time now so finally I was able to get away from work on Monday July 13, 2015. So I planned on going fishing with a friend of mine from work. I made the reservation and we met each other at the landing. Well when I got there at 5am. My friend albert arrived earlier and was in line with around 25 other people in front of him, turns out there we're 72 anglers on the boat. Reminded me of last year's trip on same boat when I fished for yellowfin tuna that's another story. The boat promptly left at 6am and headed out west toward Catalina island. The Weather was cool and water was calm made for a nice 2 1/2 hr. ride. We finally arrived at Catalina island at the spot where they had been fishing the day before water conditions had changed so we headed to search for another mark according to the captain. We were searching and was able to land several calico and few barely legal yellowtail. Then the captain got a call from other boats at the same spot where we had originally were earlier. We were less than 100 yards from the island then the captain said there were numerous fish marked so to get ready and proceeded to position the boat parallel to the island and told deck hand to start chum line. Suddenly the bite was on and most of these yellows we're 5lbs and a few other larger ones mixed in .I was able to land largest fish on the boat my 30lb yellow on large horse Sardine using custom Made Graphite USA 7"11 20-40lb Reel: Daiwa Lexa 400 PRW with 65lb Spectra power pro top shot of 30lb fluorocarbon Gamakatsu 1/0 live bait hook with numerous tangles this bruiser embarrassing I have to say took me 1/2 hr. to land. It was a great day even though there were many tangles and lost fish. Every time I go fishing I always learn new things and really enjoy the people that I meet and hearing their stories and I'm always willing in any way to help my fellow angler to have a better experience. You always have to remember to be very patient and understanding of others especially when your with 70 others anglers all trying to get bit. I really had a great time fishing and the people I met Till next time Happy Fishing
