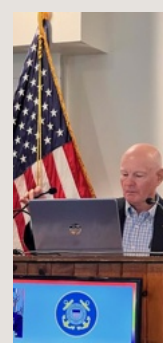
## Vision & Mission

**JANUARY 26, 2026**  
**GUEST SPEAKER**

Professor Jason Lantzer from Butler University will speak on the topic of Eisenhower and the Holocaust. This was the inspiration for his research on this subject:

“I happened to be going out to Washington over our [school’s] spring break . . . . It was there that I encountered Ike’s quote about his visit to Ohrdruf. It was one of those things I was certainly aware of, but also something that I quickly discovered no one had really investigated. We knew the quote, but it appeared that virtually no historian had bothered to ask what that might mean for how Ike saw the war or how it might have helped shape his presidency.

My dissertation advisor, James Madison of Indiana University, is fond of saying that the work of historians is sometimes about digging holes to see what we can find and sometimes about filling holes where no one has thought to look before. I decided to get to work! My central thesis is that encountering the Holocaust altered how Ike saw the war he had been waging, bringing a moral tone to what heretofore had largely been a conflict of “us vs. them.”

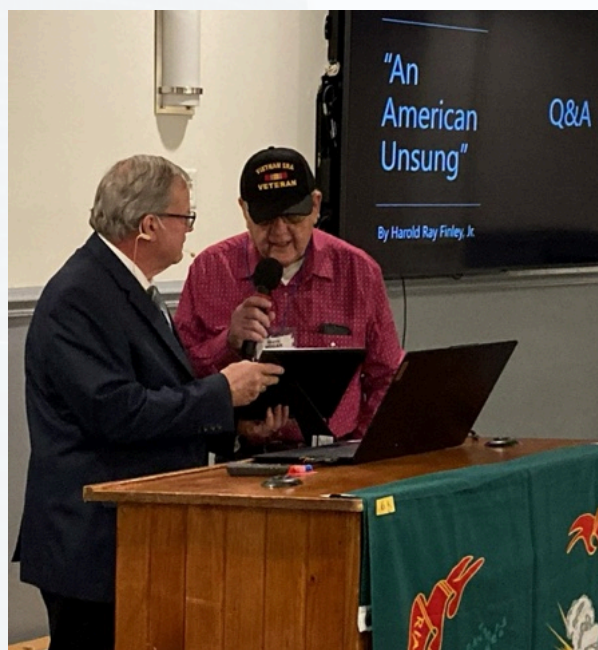
