

# **JUNIOR FLOYD KRINKIE**

## **1927 - 1996**

Junior Floyd Krinkie, 68 of Lake Township near Caseville and former resident of Kinde, died Monday, July 8 at his home following a short illness.

Mr. Krinkie was born November 15, 1927 in Lincoln Township near Kinde, son of the late Floyd and Victoria (Peyok) Krinkie. He and Beverly (Sironen) Schmidt were married November 29, 1962 in Warren.

Mr. Krinkie was a parishioner of St. Roch's Catholic Church, Caseville. He attended Kinde High School and was a World War II U.S. Naval veteran, serving in the Pacific Theater. He was a member of the Frank Horetski American Legion Post 499, Port Austin, the VFW Post 10885 and the U & I Club, Port Austin. Mr. Krinkie worked at various construction companies and was employed for a time at the former Brinker Lumber Co. in Bad Axe. He has lived in the Caseville vicinity since 1992. He enjoyed hunting and fishing, visiting with friends and playing cards.

Surviving are his wife, Beverly of Caseville; two daughters, Valarie Tomczak of Saginaw, Joan Stannett and her husband Mike of Saginaw; a son, Floyd Edward Elliott of Kinde; two step-daughters Kimberly Schmidt and Doris Schmidt, both living at home; two step-sons, Daniel Schmidt and Michael Schmidt, both living at home; two grandsons; two granddaughters; two sisters, Delores Mousseau and her husband Maurice of Kinde, and Arlene Kerr of Detroit; a brother, Ernest Krinkie of Mico, Fla.; and several nieces and nephews and aunts.
