



## Silverheels Ranch Owners Association – Fishing Policy

Revised April 6, 2016

Silverheels Ranch Owners Association Covenant #6 states in part:

“State Game, Fish and Parks Department regulations must be complied with. Subdivider and/or Silverheels Ranch Owners Association reserves right to establish and change fishing policy on common area lakes.”

**Effective April 6, 2016:**

**Fishing is allowed for SROA Members, Long term renters and their guests only.**

**When fishing at either SROA pond, ALL SROA Members or their Guests must possess an official SROA Fishing pass and produce the pass upon request.**

**SROA Fishing** Passes and SROA member automobile stickers can be obtained from the SROA Secretary/Treasurer. Passes will be issued to SROA members only. A maximum of 4 **Fishing** passes will be issued per lot.

The Silverheels Ranch Owners Association (SROA) Board of Directors has obtained a Noncommercial Private Lake License for the Small Augmentation Pond.

**The following new rules apply to the Small Augmentation Pond only:**

- No Colorado Parks and Wildlife Fishing License is required to fish in the Small Augmentation Pond.
- No live fish can be transported away from the SROA premises.
- SROA Members or guests who wish to transport their caught fish away from Silverheels Ranch property must obtain a receipt from an SROA Board Member.
- **Daily Limit for Trout is 4 fish per day**

**Dry Lake (large pond near Highway 285)**

Because the SROA cannot control access to the entire Dry Lake, the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Fishing Regulations listed below still apply:

### **COLORADO PARKS AND WILDLIFE FISHING REGULATIONS**

#### **STATEWIDE BAG&POSSESSION LIMITS**

**DAILY LIMIT FOR TROUT**

**- 4 PER DAY**

**AGGREGATE IN YOUR POSSESSION – 8**

#### **LICENSE INFORMATION**

» Licenses are valid through March 31, 2017, and are nontransferable. False statements made while buying a license render it void.

» Lost or destroyed licenses can be replaced by filling out an application and paying a fee.

» Anglers must comply with habitat stamp requirements.

**1. ADULTS** — A fishing license is required for people ages 16 and older to take fish, amphibians and crustaceans, except as noted.

**2. YOUTH** — Those under 16 can take a full bag and possession limit without a license.

(a) Youth under 16 must have a second rod stamp if fishing with more than one line at a time.

**3. SENIORS**—Colorado residents **64** and older can obtain an annual fishing license from a CPW office or license agent for \$1, which consists of the 25-cent search and rescue fee and 75 cent PEAC surcharge. A license must be carried while fishing.

(a) Low-income fishing licenses also are available for Colorado residents 64 or older. These are free and valid for a person’s lifetime. For information and eligibility requirements, contact any DOW office.

**4. SECOND ROD STAMP**—Anglers can use a second rod, hand-line or tip up by purchasing a second rod stamp. Anglers can buy only 1 second rod stamp per season.

(a) Second rod stamps are nontransferable.

(b) A second rod stamp is not required when only using trotlines or jugs.
