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MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 2022, Community Health Services will celebrate it's **40-Year Anniversary** of service to the uninsured populations of Union and Anson Counties. The Free Clinic continues to expand services and has evolved into a well-respected and necessary part of this ever-growing community. In fiscal year 2020-2021, amidst a pandemic, CHSUC Free Clinic assisted **2,085** uninsured individuals with **9,808** visits to the clinic. CHSUC is a muchneeded "medical home" for those who otherwise could not afford care.

"Healing the Hurt" continues to pave the way for affordable access to quality healthcare and medications, no matter the socio-economic status. The **Value of Services** (VOS) rendered to CHS Free Clinic patients, at no cost to them, during the 2020-2021 program year totaled **\$6,831,467**. This total reflects the costs patients would have had to incur if the Free Clinic didn't exist.

CHSUC assists uninsured adult Union and Anson County residents (ages 18+) who are without a primary care physician. Eligibility guidelines require annual incomes at or below 200% of FPL.

CHSUC serves those with many untreated health complications, due to a lack of funds and access to free healthcare including a significant number of immigrants. The immediate intervention made possible by Point of Care (POC) laboratory testing decreases the number of emergency room visits by patients who are non-emergent; thus, driving down overall healthcare costs.
