Share Your Story for Our Advent Devotional


Unseen Wings: Our Messages of Inspiration, Support, Encouragement, and Love





Reel Theology November 14: The Holdovers



Join us to watch and discuss the Holdovers, and Academy award nominated and winning holiday comedic drama about a very grumpy instructor at a New England prep school who remains on campus during Christmas break to babysit a handful of students with nowhere to go. He soon forms an unlikely bond with a brainy but damaged troublemaker, and also with the school's head cook. The film explores themes of family, chosen family, loss, grief, and renewal. The film is rated R – which is a big change from our usual Reel Theology selections. This rating is given due to frequent profanity, brief sexual material, and alcohol and marijuana use. This is such a great film that we decided to share and discuss it even though the rating is stronger than our usual selections. If you would like to eat together before the film, please bring your own dinner at 5:30. The film will begin at 6:00 with the discussion and dessert to follow.

Special Offering for Church of Peace UCC Food Pantry

Our friends at Church of Peace UCC in Rock Island have offered a weekly food pantry every Saturday for many years. They have seen a significant increase in the number of people attending each week; some weeks as many as 140 households have come through for much needed food and hygiene items. There were already challenges with maintaining the inventory to meet the demands, and now with the impending restrictions and cuts to SNAP benefits as well as the lack of funding for SNAP due to the government shutdown, they are expecting an increase in need. They could use our help to meet the expected increased demand. Hope UCC will be taking a special collection for Church of Peace's pantry program from October 30- November 16. All donations are welcome and will be forwarded to Church of Peace following worship on November 16. Please indicate 'Church of Peace' on your check or, if it is a cash donation, please use the designated envelope or make sure it is noted on the envelope you use. Church of Peace welcomes volunteers for their Pantry Saturdays or the days when they prepare the food for distribution. The Story of Hope: Helping Our Friends at Moline High School





NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17

¹ As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, ² not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. ³ Let no one deceive you in any way, for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. ⁴ He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. ⁵ Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?

¹³ But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. ¹⁴ For this purpose he called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁵ So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.
