Over the summer many exciting changes and upgrades occurred to the school and the property. Including:


- New security features, see pages 4 & 5 for details

BHPCNS SECURITY SUMMER ENHANCEMENTS



The safety and well-being of the children entrusted to BHPCNS has always been our top priority. To that end BHPCNS has been working with security experts for the past year and a half to determine the best ways to keep our children, their families, and are staff as safe as possible while still enjoying all the BHPC campus has to offer. Based on those recommendations many key action items have been implemented.

SECURITY ENHANCMENTS

- New keypad locks on the Brown, Green, BHPC office, and the door to the Bradley Hills playground located behind the office. Only the BHPCNS staff will be provided the codes to open these exterior doors. The key pads can be programmed to be operational during specific time frames and will be operational throughout the school day. These locks will allow teachers to enter the building without having to buzz the office and will cut down on potential wait times for bathroom trips and classes returning from the playgrounds and other outdoor areas.
- New keypad locks have been installed on all 4 stairwells leading to the lower level of the building. These locks will allow us to lock down the lower level of the school in the event of an emergency.
- Our upstairs classroom has also been outfitted with keypad locks so that space may be securely locked in the event of an emergency.
- New signage is being installed this week to direct visitors to the school, the church, or the Bethesda Jewish congregation and other key spaces in the building.
- Three SLOW/CHILDREN AT PLAY signs have been permanently placed, at strategic points on the
 driveways, and 4 additional, temporary and moveable SLOW/CHILDREN AT PLAY signs have been
 placed on the driveway to remind all drivers that there are children at play and to slow down.
- Added new security cameras and buzzer system to the Brown and Green Doors allowing the office to see and communicate with all guests who buzz to be entered into the building.
- The turtle playground has been enclosed by fencing.

As a result of these conversations we are making some changes to our procedures in the building.

BHPCNS SECURITY SUMMER ENHANCEMENTS CONTINUED

NEW PROCEDURES

Entering the building for morning drop-off:

O Parents, care-givers, and children may enter through the Brown and Green doors between 8:50 and 9:20 am. The doors will be manned by a school staff member to monitor and direct all people entering the building. At all other times parents and care-givers will be required to buzz to enter the building.

• Entering the building for 11:30, 12:30 or 2:30 pick-up:

 Parents and care-givers coming to collect children after their school day is finished will enter through the BROWN doors only. The brown doors will be manned by a school staff member to monitor and direct all people entering the building.

• Entering the building at non-drop-off and non-pick-up times:

o Parents, guests, care-givers, and visitors coming to school not during drop-off or pick-up may use the Brown or Green doors, but will need to be buzzed in and come directly to the office.

• Parents, guests, care-givers, and visitors signing-in:

O All parents, guests, care-givers, and visitors coming to BHPCNS and will be staying in the building, will be required to come to the office and sign-in and provide the office with an emergency contact phone number. Visitors will be required to wear a VISITOR badge. When guests leave they will also need to sign-out.

BHPCNS MORNING DROP-OFF AND END OF SCHOOL DAY DISMISSAL

NEW: All parents and children are to enter and depart BHPCNS through the Brown and Green Doors at morning drop-off. For pick-up at 11:30, 12:30 and 2:30 caregivers are to enter through the Brown Doors.

Morning Drop-Off:

Children are to be dropped off at their classroom doorways in the morning. The children will be greeted at the classroom by their teachers. Drop off is a time to say good morning to the teacher and say good bye to your child. We ask that you keep your goodbyes, simple and sweet! If your child is crying their teachers will comfort them while you are in the Rainy Day Room. We will keep you updated on your child's progress. If needed, we will have you collect your child early.

Dismissal:

Children are to be collected at their classroom door at dismissal time. Please identify yourself and the child you are collecting to the teacher. If will take us a week or two to match children and caregivers.

Please be prompt at drop off and pickup. Drop off and pick up are times to focus on your children. It is not the time to discuss your child with their teacher.





WHAT YOUR CHILD SHOULD BRING TO SCHOOL EVERYDAY!



Your child will need to bring their tote bag to and from school every day to carry all their school stuff!



Your child is to bring a water bottle to school each day. We will refill as needed.



If your child is staying for lunch, they must have a small, soft-sided bag. We refrigerate all lunches.



Folders, school provided, are to go to and from school each day. They will contain important information.



For your child's comfort on the playgrounds they are to wear closed toe shoes and socks.

PLEASE label all belongings with your child's name!

THE ASQ-3 SCREENING TOOL AND EARLY INTERVENTION FOR CHILDREN





At BHPCNS we believe that early intervention for a developmental delay can make a tremendous difference in a child's life. There is a wide range of normal development in children. Most developmental delays in children are not serious and with interventions children eventually catch up. Even children who do have serious delays can make big improvements when treatment begins as early as possible.

At BHPCNS we believe that early intervention for a developmental delay can make a tremendous difference in a child's life. There is a wide range of normal development in children. Most developmental delays in children are not serious and with interventions children eventually catch up. Even children who do have serious delays can make big improvements when treatment begins as early as possible.

To identify if a child may possibly have a developmental delay we do several screenings at BHPCNS, including the ASQ-3 for all our children, vison screenings for our 3 and 4-year olds, hearing screenings for our 3 and 4-year olds, speech screenings for children identified as possibly having a speech or language delay, and occupational therapy screenings for children identified as possibly having gross, or fine motor delays. All of the screenings are performed by vetted professionals and done in a fun and age appropriate manner. Results and recommendations are shared with parents. Any recommendations for a more thorough developmental assessment will be discussed with parents in a parent/teacher/director conference. Please contact the office if you have questions, comments, or concerns.

How Developmental Delays May Present In Young Children

There are 5 main types of developmental delays in infants and young children. They include problems with:

- language or speech articulation, expressive, and/or receptive language
- vision ability to see properly
- movement fine and gross motor skills, understanding boundaries, controlling one's movements
- social and emotional skills age appropriate interactions with adults and peers
- cognitive skills thinking and processing information

Language and/or Speech Delays in toddlers and young children are common. In fact, language and speech problems are the most common type of developmental delay. Speech refers to verbal expression, including the way words are formed. Language is a broader system of expressing and receiving information, such as being able to understand gestures.

DEVELOPMENTAL DELAYS AND EARLY INTERVENTION AT BHPCNS CONTINUED

Vision Developmental Delays can be difficult to recognize. Until about 6 months a newborn's vision is normally blurry. After 6 months a child's vision improves as the child begins to coordinate sight in both eyes. Sometimes this does not happen and vision problems such as farsightedness, near sightedness, lazy eye, may develop impacting a child's sight.

Motor Skill Developmental Delays may be related to problems with gross motor skills, such as crawling or walking, or fine motor skills, such as using fingers to grasp a spoon, hold a pencil or crayon, or more. Some children have challenges controlling their movements, they may be bouncy, or have challenges recognizing where they are in space leading to walking into things or obstacles, and/or understanding personal boundaries.

Social and Emotional Developmental Delays may be when a child experiences problems interacting with adults or other children. Other challenges include excessive tantrums, hurting themselves, being inconsolable, and forming attachments.

Cognitive Developmental Delays may present as a child not "learning" age-appropriate concepts, such as their colors or shapes, or when a child is challenged following sequential directions and developmental norms.

BHPCNS ADMINSTRATIVE NOTES & UPDATES

Tuition Payments:

Payments are due the first of each month, Sept.-May, and are considered late if not receive by the 15th of the month. If you payment is not received by the 15th, a 10% late fee will be assessed.

Automated Bill Payer System:

If you have set up an automated "bill payer" system, include the words Nursery School on the check to make sure your payment is received at the Nursery School and not deposited with the Church's donations by mistake.

Classroom and Office Email Communication:

By the end of the first week of school you should have received at least one email from your child's classroom teacher. If you have not received an email, please email your child's teacher so they may capture your email address. (Occasionally messages land in spam/trash folders.) BHPCNS staff emails all follow the same format. The teacher's first initial and last name at BHPCNS. Example: Lsobrino@bhpncs.org.

Student Records:

Each year we undergo a rigorous inspection by the Maryland State Department of Education. To be prepared we will be doing a thorough check of all our student's records. We will notify you of any missing paperwork, immunizations, etc. We ask that you submit any missing paperwork promptly. We appreciate your help in making sure our records are compliant with state regulations.

BHPCNS ADMINSTRATIVE NOTES & UPDATES CONTINUED

Healthy Kiddos:

BHPCNS is committed to keeping children healthy. If your child is not feeling well, please keep them home, and call BHPCNS's office to let us know that they will be out. We have a 24 hour fever free, vomiting free, rule and ask that you abide by that timeline.

Here at school we are:

- Asking you to wash your child's hands with soap and warm water before coming into the classrooms. Hand sanitizer is available but is not as effective as washing with soap and water.
- We will be cleaning and disinfecting classroom surfaces and toys regularly.
- Asking you to follow the CDC recommendations for flu vaccine and immunizations.

Label all Belongings:

PLEASE label all your child's belongings, jackets, tote bags, lunch bags, anything that they bring to school should be labeled with your child's name. You would be amazed at how many children don't recognize their own belongings and how many children have the same jackets, and bags. Lost and Found is outside of Room 117.

Early Morning with Bradley Bear, Lunch Bunch, and Stay and Play Programming,

Forms for these additional programs can be collected outside the office, or downloaded from our website, www.bhpcns.org. All three programs will begin on October 1, 2019. Teachers, parents and the office will all be part of determining if/when a child is ready for additional programming.

School Snacks:

BHPCNS has a school wide snack schedule. A calendar of the snack schedule is posted on the bulletin board outside the office and on <u>our website on our calendar page</u>. You may request a hard copy from the office. We serve 2 of the following food groups daily:

- A protein, i.e. organic vanilla yogurt, string cheese, etc.
- A fruit or vegetable, i.e. apple slices, carrot sticks, grapes, etc.
- A carbohydrate, i.e. graham crackers, gold fish, etc.

Children's Lunches:

BHPCNS provides organic 1% milk at lunch each day. Children are offered a choice of organic milk or filtered water at lunch time. You do not need to pack a drink with your child's lunch.

Please pack healthy, nutritious lunches for your children. BHPCNS teachers are not allowed by our licensing agency to make the children eat their "growing" foods first. If you pack a cookie and your child wants to eat that instead of their sandwich, we are technically not allowed to have them eat their sandwich first.

Children's lunches should be foods children are familiar with and should be cut into appropriate sized servings. Sandwiches cut into quarters are much easier for little ones to eat. **Gogurts are not permitted at nursery school.** We send home any easily wrapped, uneaten lunch foods. Uneaten yogurts, apple sauce cups, etc. will be tossed out. Lunch is a social time. Children like to talk and share their lives at lunch. Sometimes this gets in the way of eating their whole lunch. Don't worry as your child settles into school they will eat more of their lunch.

Donations: Before you throw it out donate it to BHPCNS

- We participate in the Ronald McDonald House Pop Tab Recycling Program. Pull off those tabs from your soda cans, cat food cans, and other cans that have one. Bring them to school and we will send them off!
- BHPCNS also collects used ink cartridges to be recycled. Drop yours by the office.
- Baby food jars are always needed to hold paint, push pins, etc. Please drop yours off in the office.
- Large oatmeal canisters to be crafted into drums.
- We can never have too many toilet paper or paper towel rolls.
- And you wouldn't believe how much newspaper we can use each month.

If your family can donate any of these items, we'd be thrilled to collect them from you in the office.

Parent's Bulletin Boards:

Across from the office is the BHPCNS' bulletin board. This space is updated regularly with our school monthly calendar, children's birthdays, and flyers about school events.

Another bulletin board by the bathrooms is used to share flyers about community programs, parenting events, sports programs, etc. that may be of interest to families. Please check these board occasionally.

BHPCNS Open Door Policy:

If at any time you have a concern or praise for something that is happening at BHPCNS, please stop by the office to share your thoughts. Without your input we don't know where we need to improve or what we are doing correctly. We value all input©
