Those who currently do mortality statistics call it "Maternal Mortality." It pertains to those who die from pregnancy problems, childbirth, or complications following giving birth.

As you would suppose, the figures from ancient times are obscure. It is thought that at times in human history, more than 30% of birth mothers died either during childbirth or afterwards with following complications.

As recently as 2017, the World Health Organization cited 300,000 maternal deaths. That's 800 deaths daily related to childbirth.

Even in the United States in 2021, there were 1,205 women who died of maternal causes. There are many factors that enter into these figures. With the awareness that most of these deaths were avoidable, some are working to see that "Every Mother Counts."

Our first Mother was Eve. God told her, "in pain you shall bring forth children." Yet, there was joy when she conceived from Adam and bore Cain. She gave God the credit as she said, "I have acquired a man from the LORD."

Motherhood is a partnership with God.

There are precious verses in the Bible which liken God's love to the love of a mother.


Can a woman forget her nursing child, And not have compassion on the son of her womb?
