Highlights of November 15 Board Meeting: Holiday Lights at Eagleview Circle Island, Enforcement Policy Strengthened, and Property Guidelines Addition for Homeowners Who Rent

The board approved having the HOA pay for holiday lights on trees at the Eagleview Circle island; modifying the Enforcement Policy such that legal fees will be charged to the violator and a "Repetitious Violation" will include annual violations; adding a section to the Property Guidelines on recommendations for homeowners who rent out their homes; and clarifying that all dog runs need Architectural Control Committee approval. Other topics covered were lawn care, fiscal review, and welcoming David Duckworth as a replacement for board member Robert Taylor.
