
# ASTRONOMICAL END OF SUMMER HARVEST

## DURATION OF THE FALL FEASTS OF YHVH 2020



(TRUMPETS) Head of the Year is the Jewish civil New Year. It is the first of the High Holidays or Yamim Noraim ("Days of Awe"), celebrated ten days before Yom Kippur. Rosh HaShanah is observed on the first two days of Tishrei, the 7th month of the Hebrew calendar. It is described in the Torah as אים התרועה day of "Screaming" or Shouting of the Shofar. -Leviticus

Also known as Day of Atonement, is the holiest day of the year for Jews. Its central themes are atonement and repentance. It is observed with a 25hour period of fasting and intensive prayer, often spending most of the day in Synagogue services. Yom Kippur completes the annual period known in Judaism as the High Holy Days or sometimes referred to as the 'Days of

(TABERNACLES) Feast of Booths, Feast of Tabernacles is a Biblical holiday celebrated on the 15th day of the month of Tishrei. It is one of the three Biblically mandated Shalosh Regalim on which Jews and Believers make pilgrimages to pre-determined sites to worship and make fellowship around the Temple in Jerusalem. Temporary booths are constructed and time is spent in them to commemorate the booths the Israelites lived in during the
