## ORDINANCE NO. 2016-3

## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF 714 SUPERIOR STREET, CHAPIN, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the corporate authorities of the Village of Chapin, Illinois, it is no longer necessary or useful to or for the best interest of the Village of Chapin to retain ownership of the real estate commonly known as 714 Superior Street, Chapin, Illinois, which is more particularly described as follows:

Lot Seventy-six (76) in the Original Plat of the Town, now Village, of Chapin, Morgan County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village of Chapin, Illinois, deem it advisable to sell the above-described real estate "as is" by requesting sealed bids pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by this reference as if they had been restated verbatim.

Section 2. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish notice of the proposed sale and the Village's request for bids on the property once a week for three consecutive weeks in *The Source* newspaper. The first publication shall be not less than thirty (30) days prior to the day provided in the notice for the opening of the sealed bids. The bids will be opened at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. The corporate authorities may accept the high bid or any other bid determined to be in the best interests of the Village by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of

the corporate authorities then holding office, but by a majority vote of those holding office they may reject any and all bids.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.
