m aphael's}$ greatest painting, perhaps the greatest painting of all the Renaissance, depicts today's Gospel account of the transfiguration. Raphael loved

this painting so much he never sold it. He hung the painting over his bed, and at his death he turned to look at it.


The transfiguration of the Lord reminds us of the glory we are all called to even when that glory is hidden. When God called Abraham, it was to make of him a great nation and to give him glory. But Abraham had to leave what he had and enter into the unknown to receive what was promised. We, too, need to set out and leave our expectations if we ever hope to enter the mysteries of faith and discover the reward we are searching for. Setting out and leaving behind are like little "deaths" that prepare us for the glory of salvation.

The Father revealed Jesus' glory to his three closest apostles so their faith would survive the cross. God didn't want them to become disillusioned or frightened by his suffering and death. A voice came down from heaven and confirmed Jesus as the Son to assure the apostles that even if he didn't seem like the Messiah in his human nature, he most certainly was.

For Reflection

What images and objects around my house or workplace remind me of my faith? How can I be a sign of the glory to which we are called? It was this image of the glorified Jesus that Raphael reflected on and labored over for years. He needed to see this transfiguration during his life and at the hour of his death to keep the faith. So do we.

All are invited to attend the Tenebrae at St. Mary's Church, in Port Jervis at 50 Ball Street. The celebrations will be at 10 AM on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, April 13, 14, and 15. About the Tenebrae: The word Tenebrae can be translated to "darkness" or "shadows" Centered around the Matins, scriptural readings and Lauds of the last three days of Holy Week. The traditions regarding this service go back at least to the ninth century. Originally celebrated after midnight, the candles were extinguished only the "Christ Candle" remained. The participants would leave the church in darkness meditating on Christ's betrayal, agony and death.



Help me to remember ho much you love me when I see her todo And, when I'm tempted to be impatient angry with her, just help me pause and gi that over to you, in gratitude for your love

Each of us will be able to grow in our ability to have brief conversations with our Lord. Whether driving or shopping, doi laundry or paying bills, working in our office or walking down the hall to the bathroom, we can use brief "background" n cents to connect with our Lord. These moments of "contemplation in action" will give a character and shape to our day. Le ecomes a living reality for us when our days are spent with the Lord, listening to his love for us, calling us to gratitude as freedo
