126 E. Main Street, Ville Platte, LA Minutes for November 10, 2020 held at 5:00 PM

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Ville Platte met in a Regular Session in the Council Chamber in City Hall, 126 E. Main St. Ville Platte, LA on Tuesday, November 10, 2020 5:00 PM. The Meeting was conducted through Zoom due to the Coronavirus pandemic and in compliance to the Governor's stay at home orders, the City Council meeting will be held online.

The Regular Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Vidrine.

Following the Invocation and Pledge, roll called by Shountilez L. Williams, City Clerk, and announced that a quorum was present. The Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Ville Platte were duly convened as the Governing Authority of the City of Ville Platte.

Attending in person: Mayor Jennifer Vidrine, City Clerk Shountilez Williams, Councilmen Bryant Riggs, Lionel Anderson, Councilwoman Lemoine, Administrative Assistant Hilda Edwards and Fire Chief Neal Lartigue.

• Minutes-Regular Monthly Meeting October 8, 2020

It was moved by Councilwoman Lemoine and seconded by Councilman Sam to approve the minutes of October 8, 2020 as presented. All in favor, motion carried unanimously

Monthly Report for October 2020 (Budget to Actual)

Mayor Vidrine announced the expenses for the month of October were \$177,470.93 expenses for the month of September were \$171,916.27; the expenses for the month of October were \$5,554.66 more than the month of September due to some unexpected expenses.

It was moved by Councilman Perron and seconded by Councilman Anderson to approve the Expense Report for the month of October. Council compared budget to actual as presented, year to date from the monthly report. All in favor, motion carried unanimously

Mayor's Comments:

- 1. November 11th is Veteran's Day and Mayor Vidrine recognized the Veteran's for everything they've done for our country.
- 2. Mayor Vidrine announced, DOTD will be repairing and/or overlaying Main St., Lasalle, and Tate Cove Road, there are State Roads. DOTD will be back in Ville Platte to do an assessment of the drainage on Lasalle St., South Chataignier Road and Main St. They will be cutting trees branches that are obstructing street lights on the three main roads.
- 3. Main Street sidewalks are on the list for repairs.
- 4. Councilwoman Lemoine brought up the issue of faded street signs. Mayor Vidrine said they will be replaced in French and English.
- 5. Med Express will be helping the City by providing a listing of all of the street signs and stop signs that needs to be replaced throughout the city.
- 6. Mayor Vidrine announced there will be no Christmas Parade due to COVID-19 pandemic. The Town Square Park will be lit up, but there will be no gathering in the park for lighting and City Hall will be decorate for window viewing only.
- 7. Mayor Vidrine reminded everyone that City Hall is not Closed, the drive thru is open and if anyone needs in person service they can come inside.
- 8. Mayor Vidrine announced, they are working on purchasing a backhoe the Street Sweeper is being repaired.

Council Comments:

- 1. Councilman Riggs inquired about the Utility Rate changes and Councilwoman Lemoine also inquired on the large water bills, that people have had issues with.
- 2. Councilman Anderson commended the landlords in his District for taking the initiative to cut their grass and take down some of the dilapidated houses.
- 3. Mayor Vidrine announced that the Substation across from L & V area is open with police presence and security cameras will be installed soon.
- 4. Councilwoman Lemoine asked about the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Police Jury. Ms. Lemoine announced that representatives from the Lieutenant Governor's office were here to do a walk- through of the City's Main St.

2. Intergovernmental Agreement, Fire District #2 & 911 Communications

It was moved by Councilwoman Lemoine and seconded by Councilman Sam to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with Fire District # and 911 Communications. All in favor, motion carried.

3. Louisiana Compliance Questionnaire

It was moved by Councilman Joseph and seconded by Councilman Sam to approve the Louisiana Compliance Questionnaire as requested by the City's Auditor. All in favor, motion carried.

4. Dump Trailers

Mayor Vidrine requested the purchase of two new dump trailers for the Street Department. It was moved by Councilman Riggs and seconded by Councilman Anderson to approve the purchase of two new dump trailers. All in favor, motion carried.

5. Fire Chief Appointment

Mayor Vidrine announced the appointment of Christopher Soileau, as the new Fire Chief for the Ville Platte Fire Department, effectively November 20, 2020. He was selected from three candidates who applied for the position. .

It was moved by Councilwoman Lemoine and seconded by Councilman-Riggs to approve the appointment of Chris Soileau as the new Fire Chief. All in favor, motion carried.
