What is the Feast of the Epiphany?

This feast commemorates the mysterious visit of the *magi* to the Baby Jesus. The traditional date of Epiphany is January 6, but in the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8. "Epiphany" means "manifestation." It comes from Greek roots that mean "to show, to display" (*phainein*) and "on, to" (*epi*-). An epiphany is thus a time when something is shown, displayed, or manifested to an audience.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (*magi*) from the East, together with His baptism in the Jordan, and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the magi, the first Gentiles to encounter Christ, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations

who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the King of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations.

The gifts the Wise Men brought — frankincense, myrrh, and gold — point not only to Christ's divinity and his revelation to the Magi as the King of Kings, but also to his crucifixion. In giving herbs traditionally used for burial, these gifts bring a theological sense of anticipation of what is to come.

2025 Jubilee Holy Year *Information to Know* As Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica on the evening of December 24, 2024 he ushered in the widely anticipated 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope. The Pope reminded the faithful that with the opening of the Holy Door, the new Jubilee was inaugurated, which exhorts each one of us

to enter into the mystery of this extraordinary event. During the Pope's homily he proclaimed: "Tonight, the door of hope has opened wide to the world... *God speaks to each of us and says:*

'there is hope also for you!' With haste let us set out to behold the Lord who is born for us, our hearts joyful and attentive, ready to meet Him and then to bring hope to the way we live our daily lives."

Two of the bigger events of the *Jubilee of Hope* will be the canonizations of Blessed Carlo Acutis during the Jubilee of Teenagers on April 27 and of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati during the Jubilee of Young People on April 3.
