When it comes to volunteering at the Food Bank, summer is the perfect time to involve kids in our projects.



es, giving tours of our facility and sharing how their help impacts lives. Some of our children's garden participants worked extra hard in the garden and were able to enter their produce in the Tri Rivers Fair, winning several ribbons, including "Best of Show" for their carrots. And alongside our regular volunteers, kids of all ages took turns filling carts and stocking shelves, all while entertaining us with their riddles, dance moves and smiles.

Notebooks and pencils aren't the only things needed for the school year — being able to get enough food is even more important. How is any kid expected to pay attention in class if their tummy is growling? But when kids are fed, they thrive, they struggle less with their school work and behave better. In 2023, the Salina Food Bank distributed 5,144 food kits to local elementary and middle schools to help keep kids fed during the academic year, and an additional 250 summer school food kits for those enrolled in summer school. Young kids are not the only students battling hunger. Did you know that the Salina Food Bank has partnered with KWU, K-State Salina, Salina Tech and Salina Adult Education Center at various times to help their respective students learn how to access our programs and fuel their learning? We also support their on-campus efforts to have free food, especially fresh produce,



available. With school now in session, our team is once again looking for extra hands to help deliver food kits and food totes around town for hungry students.
