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STATEMENT OF FAITH

As part of the enrollment process we ask that each family prayerfully read and affirm our statement of faith. Please have one parent/legal guardian sign the statement below.

We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are infallible; verbally inspired by God, inerrant in the original writings and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and life. (Deut. 4:1-2; Ps. 19:7-10; 119:11, 89, 105; Isa. 40:8; Mt. 5:17-18; Lk. 21:33; II Tim. 3:15-17; II Peter 1:19-21)

We believe in one God, eternally existing in three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Gen. 1:1; Ex. 3:14; 20:1ff; Deut. 6:4; Mt. 28:19; Mk. 1:9-11; Jn. 4:24; 14:6-13)

We believe God created man in His own image as male and female and is therefore worthy of value and respect. However every man is a sinner by nature and choice and is spiritually dead and alienated from God. In and of himself man is incapable of redeeming his lost and depraved condition. (Gen. 1:26-30; 2:5,7,18-22; Ps. 8:3-6; 32:1-5; 51:5; Acts 17:26-31; Rom. 1:19-32; 3:10-18,23; 7:14-25)

We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male or female. These two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God. (Genesis 1:26-27) **Rejection of one's biological sex is a rejection of the image of God with that person. We affirm God's design for gender as determined by biological sex and not by self-perception and we oppose all efforts to validate transgender identity.**

We believe that the term of "marriage" has only one meaning: the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union, as delineated in Scripture. (Genesis 2:18-25) **We believe that God intends sexual intimacy to occur only between a man and a woman who are married to each other.** (I Corinthians 6:18, 7:2-5; Hebrews 13:4) **We believe that God has commanded that no intimate sexual activity be engaged in outside of a marriage between a man and a woman.**

We believe that sexual activity between same sex couples is an abomination (Lev. 18:22; Romans 1:26-27). **We believe the body is not mean for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body** (I Cor. 6:13b).

We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary and is fully God and fully man. (Ps. 2:7ff; 110:1ff; Mt. 1:18-23; 11:27; Lk. 1:26-38; Jn. 1:1-18,29; Col. 1:13-22; Heb. 1:1-3)

We believe that the sinless Lord Jesus died for the sins of all mankind as a substitutionary sacrifice, was buried and raised again on the third day in bodily form and ascended to the Father. All who repent and believe in Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit and by His grace are justified through His shed blood. (Gen. 3:15; Isa. 53; Mt.1:21; 16:21-26; Jn. 1:11-14,29; Rom. 1:16-18; 5:8-10; 6:1-23; 2nd Cor. 5:17-20; Gal. 2:20; Eph. 2:8-22; Col. 1:9-22)

We believe that Christ will personally return and set up His kingdom, wherein He will rule and reign in righteousness. (Mt. 16:27; 4:27,30,36,44; Jn. 14:1-3; I Cor. 15:24-28, 35-58; Rev. 20:11-22:13)

We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just to eternal life in Heaven and the unjust to eternal damnation in Hell. (Mk. 9:43-48; Lk. 16:19-26; 17:22-37; Acts 17:31; Rom. 14:10; I Cor. 15:35-58; Heb. 9:27-28; Rev. 20:1-22:13)

We believe in the present indwelling ministry of the Holy Spirit to equip and empower all Christians to become more like Christ. (Gen. 1:2; Mt. 3:16; 12:28-32; Jn. 14:16-17, 26; 15:26; 16:7-14; Acts 1:8; 2:1-4, 38; Rom. 8:1-16, 26-27; 1st Cor. 2:10-14; Gal. 5:22-23; Eph. 5:18)

We believe that Christ loved the church and gave Himself for her and is the Head of the church. Therefore, all believers are joined to His body and should unite in worship, fellowship and the ministry of the Gospel through a local church. (Matt. 16:15-19; Acts 2:41-47; I Cor. 3:16-17; chapters 12-14; Eph. 1:22, 23; 2:21, 22; 5:22-32; Rev. 2 & 3)

- 2) We accept the challenge to "train up a child in the way he should go" (Proverbs 22:6), and we do state that this training will be carried on in the home and further understand we have an obligation to be actively involved in the education of our children. - 7) We will support the school by involvement in parent-teacher conferences, open house, Parent-Teacher Fellowship activities, workdays, and other school sponsored meetings and activities when possible.
- 8) We give permission for our child to travel to scheduled field trips and academic competitions. Parents will be notified of scheduled activities.
- 9) We will fulfill our financial commitment to pay for the educational services the school is providing for our child (tuition, fees, etc.) and these payments are non-refundable and subject to late fees.

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LEGACY CHRISTIAN ACADEMY PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

Our philosophy is to educate the whole child in a like manner to Jesus:

And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men. Luke 2:52 (NKJV)

To challenge students spiritually, which is of utmost importance, we will provide an atmosphere throughout the school that is conducive to a child receiving Jesus Christ as his/her personal Savior and following Him as a disciple. Since all truth is God's truth, Biblical content will be intentionally integrated within every subject. Furthermore, there will be a persistent emphasis on learning God's Word, developing a personal prayer and devotional life, defending and sharing our Christian faith, plus understanding and practicing our Statement of Faith and Core Values. Other events such as chapels, special speakers, etc. will be utilized to enrich students' spiritual lives. Students will be expected to maintain an active fellowship within their church.

To challenge students academically we will maintain excellent scholastic standards and encourage them to discover the true joy of learning by obtaining wisdom, the beginning of knowledge. Furthermore, each subject will be taught from a distinctively Christian worldview with a strong emphasis on the authority of God's Word, respect, patriotism, self-control, discipline and problem solving. Additionally, academic excellence will be provided by employing the most highly qualified teachers/staff available, each with a clear Christian testimony, both in word and deed.

To challenge students physically we will provide a well rounded physical education program which begins with teaching that the body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Emphasis will be placed on health education, proper self respect and the respect of others, good sportsmanship, teamwork and participation in daily exercise.

To challenge students socially, we will encourage proper biblical relationships with others by helping them see people through the eyes of Jesus. We will seek to develop respect for the authorities of God, home, church and government. In order to develop social behavior and fellowship with their classmates various activities will be provided throughout the year such as class parties, celebrations at Christmas and Easter, field trips, community service projects and other programs.

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Covenant Between Parent and Legacy Christian Academy

Kingdom Education is a life-long, Christ-centered process of leading a child into a new identity with Christ and developing him/her according to the specific ability given to him/her by Christ so that the child will be empowered to live a life characterized by love, trust, and obedience to Christ. (Dr. Glen Schultz, Kingdom Education, 1998) Legacy Christian Academy covenants with parents to help parents guide and direct their children to become fully devoted Disciples of Christ.

1. The education of children and youth is the primary responsibility of parents (Deut. 6:4-9; 11:18-21; Psa. 78:1-7; Psa. 127:3; Prov. 22:6; Mal. 2:13-16; Eph. 6:4). "Parents will be welcome. Parents will be viewed as the primary educators of the children. The teacher will not see himself or herself as a replacement for, but as a partner with, the parents." They will work together. The parent will stay informed through school communications and conferences.

2. The education of children and youth is a 24 hour-a-day, 7 days-per-week process that continues from birth to maturity (Deut. 6:7; 11:19; Prov. 22:6). "Students will learn what the Bible says, learn sound doctrines, learn church history, learn every subject (literature, history, math, science, music, art) in the light of the Holy Scriptures." Parents will be intentional in talking with their children about things of the Lord when they sit at home or walk along the road or when they lie down and get up.

3. The education of children and youth must have as its primary goals the salvation of and discipleship of the next generation (Psa. 78:6-7; Matt. 28:19-20). "The school will be committed to teaching students the clear truth of God, in order that the student might become fully devoted as a follower of Jesus Christ." Parents will guide children to salvation and attend a Bible believing church.

4. The education of children and youth must be based on God's Word as absolute truth (Matt. 24:35; Psa. 119). "The school will point the student to God's Word for wisdom or truth." Parents will support Biblical inerrancy.

5. The education of children and youth must hold Christ as preeminent in all of life (Col. 2:3; 6-10). "Believing the truth of the Bible, the school is devoted to a God-centered approach in life and learning." Parents point children to Christ as in Christ is all wisdom and knowledge.

6. The education of children and youth must not hinder the spiritual and moral development of the next generation (Matt. 18:6; 19:13-14; Mk. 10:13-16; Lk. 18:15-17). "The school is one place where character is molded, where teachers understand that they will have a profound impact upon the life of their students." Parents role model and teach morality as taught in the word of God.

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7. The education of children and youth, if and when delegated to others by parents, must be done so with utmost care to ensure that all teachers follow these principles (Ex. 18:21; I Sam. 1:27-28; 3:1-10). "The school realizes each child will be met at his level of ability and be aided to be thankful for what God has given him and to use what God has given to him. Another way of saying this is that each child will be taught the joy of faithful stewardship of his own abilities and talents." Parents respect and support teachers in their role and work with teachers so that each child achieves their full ability.

8. The education of children and youth results in the formation of a biblical belief system or worldview (Lk. 6:40). Parents create a home built on biblical standards with a decidedly Christian worldview. The school reinforces those standards and worldview.

9. The education of children and youth must lead to true wisdom by connecting all knowledge to a worldview frame of reference (Rom. 1:20; Psa. 19:1; Prov. 4:5,7; 3:19; 9:10; Psa. 104:24; 136:5; Jere. 10:12; Rom. 11:33; Luke 11:52; Col. 2:3; I Cor. 8:1; 13:8; Rom. 1:28). "The school tells students why they live, for whom they should live, what it means to live: God, and God alone." Parents demonstrate that mindset and point their child to God.

10. The education of children and youth must have a view of the future that includes the eternal perspective (Col. 3:1-2; Matt. 6:19-20; 2 Tim. 4:6-8; Acts 20:24; Heb. 11:13; Col. 3:23-24). "The Bible says that all things were created for God's glory. The unifying principle of knowledge is to know God and His Son Jesus Christ, which is eternal life." Parents are professed Christians who are most sensitive to the calling of the Spirit in the lives of their children. The teachers are professed Christians who recognize spiritual distress in a child and work with parents to direct the child to Christ.
