Baptisms—Baptismal arrangements must be made by the PARENTS of the child at the Parish Office. Parents and godparents *must* attend a baptismal preparation class before the baptism. Other requirements will be discussed at the initial interview.

Matrimony—Weddings are celebrated throughout the year. In accord with Church Law, at least one of the parties to be married must be a member of St. Joseph, otherwise special permissions are needed. Marriage preparation is to begin at least 6 months prior to the wedding. It is strongly recommended that a couple planning to be married at St. Joseph contact the Parish before making any contractual arrangements with a facility for their reception. During the initial interview with the priest of the Parish, the couple will be provided with all the necessary information needed for their preparation experience.



THANK YOU AND GOD BLESS!

I can't quite believe that my time as Pastor of St. Joseph Parish and School has come to a close. Although, these last couple of months has been the most challenging of all the time I have been here, I leave with a GRATEFUL HEART and filled with wonderful memories!

I remember.... **My First Sunday Vigil Mass!** It was a rainy afternoon and I walked into our church to find that our sound system had failed. I had to use our portable speakers and tried as hard as I can to project my voice so I can be heard. As if that wasn't enough! At the end of mass, I invited our visiting seminarian to dinner only to find that we were "trapped" as the electronic gate wouldn't open. We ended up walking to BJ's next door and got caught in a torrential downpour. We were soaked to the skin, BJ's was over crowded and we ended up eating hot dogs for dinner at Five Guys! Thankfully, we haven't had many problems with our sound system since then.

I remember **My First School Opening!** New Pastor, new Maintenance Supervisor, New Principal. Coming in on July 1, 2014, we had a month to prepare the school – cleaning, servicing the swamp coolers, tidying up, etc. After I had greeted the children, I walked towards the soccer field and was horrified to find that there was about half a foot of uncut grass. Too bad, all our maintenance crew were occupied. So, I took out the lawn mower, asked how it is operated and, in my black clerical attire under 100 degree heat, cut the grass myself. I was amused at parents jumping out of their cars taking pictures through the school fence! I had to do it a few more times until I eventually "retired" from that job!

I remember **The Heat!** Coming from a country where "swamp coolers" don't exist, I didn't know that it doesn't work in high humidity. Visiting classrooms at various times of the day, I realized that the heat was overpowering. To remedy the situation, I went to ALL the Home Depot and Lowe's outlets buying out whatever portable units I can get. The heat was still oppressive. It was during this time that I decided to put in air-conditioning at the school. Now, our children and teachers enjoy cool and comfortable classrooms.

I remember **The Purple Church Windows!** There were many times I would open the church on a Saturday afternoon for confessions to find broken purple glass on the floor. My fear was that we may have been broken in, only to find out that when birds hit the brittle window panes, it simply shatters! I would cover them up with whatever I can find – plastic sheeting, cardboard, aluminum foil, etc. Absolutely horrible! It was then that I proceeded to save up money to change it. The blessing came through a parish "GODMOTHER". With a stroke of her signature, the windows were paid for and our savings went to The next project!

I remember **The "Old" Healy Hall!** Built in 1953, it was the original church and from what I gathered it was renovated in the year 2000. The first thing I did was to subscribe to Architectural Digest and Phoenix Home and Garden magazines to get some ideas... and set to work. The money we had was only good for a new floor and a coat of paint. However, when work progressed, other "GODFATHERS AND GODMOTHERS" appeared! Thus, we had our air conditioning system fixed, new Audio-Visual equipment and new blinds. We even had the "red doors" – which some people didn't like – until we found out about the "Theology of the Red Door" as a sign of sanctuary! We haven't heard any complaints since then!

I remember **The Guadalupe Procession!** As Vocations Director and member of the Presbyteral Council, I always advocated for a Guadalupe Procession for the diocese. Unfortunately, I didn't get the support to have one. Finally, when I became Pastor, I sought out Emilio and Maria Moya and together with Chuy Cornides and Ramses Enriquez, they listened to my "dream". Thereafter, Martin Gonzalez and Dr. Chris Arslanian, faithful Cathedral parishioners, loved the idea and joined us. Thus, the first of St. Joseph's Guadalupe Procession was born. And as they say, the rest is history!

I remember **Our Lady's Sanctuary of Prayer!** Having a chapel at the Parish Center was wonderful; however, it always reminded of being in the "waiting room of Urgent Care". It became my dream to renovate it. During a pilgrimage to San Juan de los Lagos in Mexico, I chanced upon a gallery that had a most unusual but very moving depiction of the Holy Trinity. It took me all of 15 seconds to decide to buy it. Now it hangs proudly in a more prayerful environment.

I remember **My First Eating Etiquette Class!** Growing up with a very properly mannered Grandmother, I learned how to eat with proper manners at a young age. Although I secretly prefer to eat like a "savage"; at the very least, I had that knowledge in store in case I need it. So, I wanted to teach our school children what I had learned when I was their age. Thankfully, a school parent provided me with most of the china, silverware and glassware to start me off. It was a wonderful experience as I taught them how to set up and be comfortable in fine dining etiquette. One of the mothers, after witnessing our "class", asked, "Father Ricky, can we invite you to our home for dinner so you can teach my husband how to eat properly?"

I remember **"GOOD MORNING, FR. RICKY!"** For a few years, I would stand at the entrance of the school during most mornings and would teach the children to greet me with "Good morning, Fr. Ricky!" What was amusing was that it was their parents who were dropping them off that felt pressured! Sometimes, as they were approaching me at the gate, I would hear the Mom's or Dad's warn their children in hushed tones, "Fr. Ricky is there. Now, don't forget to say, 'Good morning, Fr. Ricky!'" By then, I would be laughing because the parents end up greeting me before their children did.

There are so many memories that I hold in my heart and many more lessons that I learned in my 4 years as Pastor. I will miss the affection that I received from parishioners and the kind words of encouragement. I will also miss the Filipino food that I was supplied with from my dearest friends. I will miss the loyalty and undying support of our Parish and School Staff.

Lastly, I say **"Thank You"** to you for *"putting up with me"* these last 4 years! Forgive me for my shortcomings and know that I leave with no rancor in my heart towards anyone but only fond and grateful memories!

¡GRACIAS Y DIOS LOS BENDIGA!

No puedo creer que mi tiempo como en la Parroquia y Escuela de San José llegado a su fin. Aunque, estos últimos meses han sido los más desafiantes de todo el tiempo que he estado aquí, ¡me voy con un CORAZÓN AGRADECIDO y lleno de maravillosos recuerdos!

Recuerdo... **¡Mi primera misa de Vigilia del domingo!** Era una tarde lluviosa y entré a la iglesia para encontrar que el sistema de sonido estaba descompuesto. Tuve que usar los parlantes portátiles e intenté con todas mis fuerzas proyectar mi voz para poder hacerme escuchar. Como si eso no fuera suficiente. Al final de la misa, invité a cenar al seminarista visitante solo para descubrir que estábamos "atrapados" porque la puerta electrónica no funcionaba. Terminamos caminando al restaurante de al lado BJ y quedamos atrapados en un aguacero torrencial. Estábamos empapados hasta la piel, BJ's estaba abarrotado y terminamos comiendo hot dogs en Five Guys! Afortunadamente, no hemos tenido muchos problemas con nuestro sistema de sonido desde entonces.

Recuerdo ... **¡La apertura de la escuela!** Nuevo pastor, nuevo supervisor de mantenimiento, nuevo director. Al llegar el 1 de julio de 2014, teníamos un mes para preparar la escuela: limpieza, mantenimiento de los coolers de agua, arreglar todo, etc. Después de saludar a los niños, caminé hacia el campo de fútbol y me horroricé al descubrir que había aproximadamente medio pie de hierba sin cortar. Que pena, todo el personal de mantenimiento estaba ocupado. Entonces, saqué la cortadora de césped, pregunté cómo funcionaba y, con mi atuendo clerical negro bajo 100 grados de temperatura, corté la hierba yo mismo. ¡Me divertí que los padres saltaran de sus autos tomando fotos a través de la cerca de la escuela! ¡Tuve que hacerlo unas cuantas veces más hasta que finalmente "me retiré" de ese trabajo!

Recuerdo ... **¡El calor!** Viniendo de un país donde no existen "coolers de agua", no sabía que no funcionan cuando hay mucha humedad. Al visitar las aulas en diferentes momentos del día, me di cuenta de que el calor era abrumador. Para remediar la situación, fui a TODOS los puntos de venta de Home Depot y Lowe's y compre las unidades portátiles que pude conseguir. El calor aún era opresivo. Fue durante este tiempo que decidí poner el aire acondicionado en la escuela. Ahora, nuestros niños y maestros disfrutan de aulas frescas y cómodas.

Recuerdo ... **¡Las Ventanas Color Morado de la Iglesia!** Había muchas veces que abría la iglesia un sábado por la tarde para confesiones y encontraba cristales rotos en el suelo. Mi temor era que pudiéramos haber sido asaltados, solo para descubrir que cuando las aves golpean los vidrios frágiles de las ventanas, ¡simplemente se quiebran! Los tapaba con lo que podía encontrar: láminas de plástico, cartón, papel de aluminio, etc. ¡Absolutamente horrible! Fue entonces cuando procedí a ahorrar dinero para cambiarlo. La bendición vino a través de una parroquia "MADRINA". Con un trazo de su firma, las ventanas fueron pagadas y nuestros ahorros fueron a ... El próximo proyecto!

Recuerdo ... **¡El "viejo" Healy Hall!** Construido en 1953, era la iglesia original y, por lo que me informé, fue renovado en el año 2000. Lo primero que hice fue suscribirme a Architectural Digest y las revistas Phoenix Home y Garden para obtener algunas ideas ... y ponerme a trabajar. El dinero que teníamos, solo alcanzaba para un piso nuevo y una capa de pintura. Sin embargo, cuando el trabajo progresó, ¡aparecieron otros "PADRINOS Y MADRINAS"! Por lo tanto, obtuvimos nuestro sistema de aire acondicionado, nuevos equipos audiovisuales y nuevas persianas. Incluso tuvimos las "puertas rojas", que a algunas personas no les gustaron, hasta que descubrimos la "Teología de la Puerta Roja" como un signo de santuario. ¡No hemos escuchado ninguna queja desde entonces!

Recuerdo ... **¡La Procesión de Guadalupe!** Como Director de Vocaciones y miembro del Consejo Presbiterial, siempre defendí una Procesión de Guadalupe para la diócesis. Desafortunadamente, no obtuve el apoyo. Finalmente, cuando me convertí en pastor, busqué a Emilio y María Moya y, junto con Chuy Cornides y Ramsés Enriquez, escucharon mi "sueño". A partir de entonces, Martín González y el Dr. Chris Arslanian, fieles feligreses de la Catedral, amaron la idea y se unieron a nosotros. Por lo tanto, nació la primera procesión de la Virgen de Guadalupe en San José. ¡Y como dicen, el resto es historia!

Recuerdo ... **¡Santuario de Oración de Nuestra Señora!** Tener una capilla en el Centro Parroquial fue maravilloso; sin embargo, siempre recordaba estar en la "sala de espera de Urgent Care". Se convirtió en mi sueño renovarlo. Durante una peregrinación a San Juan de los Lagos en México, me encontré con una galería que tenía una representación muy inusual pero muy conmovedora de la Santísima Trinidad. Me llevó 15 segundos decidir comprarlo. Ahora se cuelga con orgullo en un ambiente más lleno de oración.

Recuerdo ... **¡Mi Primera Clase de Etiqueta al Comer!** Al crecer con una abuela muy educada, aprendí a comer con buenos modales a una edad temprana. Aunque en secreto prefiero comer como un "salvaje"; al menos, tenía ese conocimiento por si lo necesitaba. Entonces, quise enseñarles a nuestros alumnos lo que había aprendido cuando yo tenía su edad. Afortunadamente, un padre de la escuela me proporcionó la mayor parte de la porcelana, los cubiertos y la cristalería para comenzar. Fue una experiencia maravillosa, ya que les enseñé a prepararse y a sentirse cómodos con la buena etiqueta de la cena. Una de las madres, después de presenciar nuestra "clase", preguntó: "Padre Ricky, ¿podemos invitarlo a cenar a nuestra casa para que pueda enseñarle a mi esposo a comer bien?"

Recuerdo ... **"BUENOS DÍAS , PADRE RICKY!** "Durante algunos años, me quedaba en la entrada de la escuela la mayoría de las mañanas y les enseñaba a los niños a saludarme con un " Buenos días, padre. ¡Ricky! "¡Lo que fue divertido fue que fueron sus padres quienes los hicieron que se sintieran presionados! A veces, cuando se acercaban a la puerta, oía que mamá o papá advertían a sus hijos en voz baja: "El padre Ricky está allí. Ahora, no te olvides de decir, 'Buenos días, p. Ricky '! "Para entonces, me reía porque los padres terminan saludándome antes que sus hijos.

Hay tantos recuerdos que guardo en mi corazón y muchas más lecciones que aprendí en mis 4 años como parroco. Extrañaré el afecto que recibí de los feligreses y las amables palabras de aliento. También extrañaré la comida filipina que me proporcionaron mis amigos más queridos. Extrañaré la lealtad y el apoyo imperecedero de nuestro personal parroquial y escolar.

¡Por último, les doy las **"Gracias"** por **"aguantarme"** estos últimos 4 años! Perdónenme mis deficiencias y sepa que me voy sin rencor en mi corazón, ¡solo con recuerdos cariñosos y agradecidos!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's midsummer day! We have the advantage of celebrating one of the great hidden treasures of our liturgical calendar on a Sunday this year. There are only three "nativity" feasts on our calendar: for the Lord, the Blessed Mother (September 8), and today's birth of the Baptist. Today's date is anchored by the Annunciation (March 25), when Mary learns not only of her own child's advent, but of Elizabeth's child. We are exactly half a year away from Christmas Eve. There are strong traditions around this feast. Just as the winter solstice provides a rich vocabulary for Christmas, so does the abundance of light at midsummer inform this celebration. Just as at Christmas, a religious festival spills over into culture. As summer light reaches its peak, the sun-drenched zones of northern Europe see people staying up all night, lighting "St. John's fires" in the long summer twilight. Bonfires seem to be the unifying force in all these celebrations, kindled along the shores of the St. Lawrence in Quebec and Montreal, with harbor illuminations in France. You may be most interested in the custom in San Juan, Puerto Rico, the Baptist's own city. People there will leap into the sea between midnight and dawn to honor John. Why not find your way to a pool, a lake, or a sandy beach today and plunge in to recall your baptism? It's a tradition!
