COVID Vaccination Appt. Info.

Good afternoon all –

As some of you might already be aware, Alternatives for Older Adults is partnering with the Rock Island County Health Department in an effort to help Illinois residents over the age of 60 make an appointment to get a vaccination for COVID-19.

Beginning <u>March 1st</u>, Alternatives will be utilizing IRIS to accept referrals regarding COVID-19 vaccinations for this population. If you are working with a client that needs assistance setting up their COVID-19 vaccination appointment and meets the States eligibility requirements, please make the referral through IRIS.

Currently you can find the appropriate profile in IRIS under **COVID-19 Appt**.

Assistance under the service area filters **COVID-19** and **Older adults** to help narrow down your search. When making a referral, please make sure that the family profile is the individual who is to receive the vaccination. The following information is required when submitting the referral.

- Select that you are inquiring about a COVID-19 Vaccination appointment
- Whether they need assistance for transportation
- Name
- Address
- Date of Birth
- Demographic information for that Individual
- Phone Number AND/OR Email

The process is as follows:

• A partnering organization will make the referral in IRIS.

(This places them on a waitlist)

• A member of Alternatives Staff/Volunteer will reach out to the individual for intake

- When a vaccine becomes available, Alternatives staff/volunteer will schedule and reach out to the individual to complete registration
- Alternatives staff/volunteer will complete the referral indicating the outcome

As more people become eligible for the vaccine, Quad Cities Open Network will begin a waitlist and will follow a similar process for individuals who fall out of Alternatives scope of services.
