#### BACKPACK BUDDIES Needs Your Support

It may be hard to believe in this day and age, but some children in Westmoreland County don't have enough to eat. Ebenezer is helping to address this urgent need through the Backpack Buddies Program, coordinated through Westmoreland County schools in conjunction with the Healthy Harvest Food Bank.

While the schools provide breakfast and lunch during the week, the weekends may mean some children will go to bed hungry. Backpack Buddies provides the ingredients for six meals for at-risk children to take home on Fridays, and on the last day before a school holiday, to keep them fed over the weekends.

Donations of specific foods are welcome, but financial support is critical. Donations may be given to Linda Fallin; checks should be made payable to EUMC and designated for the Backpack Program.

#### Fellowship Hall Floor Renovation Planned

The floor of the Fellowship Hall has been damaged by water seeping up through the concrete in the 1953-built section of the Hall. The Trustees have been searching diligently to find a contractor who can address this issue. Merely replacing the flooring will not solve the problem; the concrete itself will have to be removed, a drainage system constructed, and new concrete poured. Otherwise, the water problem will ruin any new flooring we have installed.

The church has received a bid from a Fredericksburg contractor for this work. Removing the concrete will be a major effort and will require that the walls and ceiling of the Fellowship Hall be covered so that the dust and debris generated when the old concrete is removed will not damage the rest of the Hall.

When the Trustees and the contractor conclude their discussions, they will set a date (probably around mid-November) for the renovation, working around the dates of the various activities scheduled for the Fellowship Hall.

This stage of the renovation should take about two weeks. A second stage, installing the new floor, will occur later after the concrete work is completed.

Bill Taylor, Chair of the Trustees, is spear-heading this effort. We'll keep you informed through the church bulletins as decisions are made and work is scheduled.

When we are in sick or in pain, or any time we need comfort, we know that God is there to wrap His arms around us. A very tangible way to share this feeling is with a Prayer Quilt. Quilts, made by the members of EUMC, are available for anyone who needs prayer.

The ministry works this way: the quilt-giver who know of another's need for pray asks that person what his or her prayer would be. Then the giver shares that prayer with the congregation. Each member of the congregation is invited to tie a knot in one of the strings stitched through the quilt while they pray the receiver's prayer. Then the quilt is given to the receiver as a token of our – and God's – love.

Right now, **Ebenezer has only one quilt left**. Therefore, we are asking for volunteers to sew tops (about a 3' by 3' square) which we can then finish into quilts. See Cindy Flickinger or Linda Fallin to help in this ministry of comfort.

# Second Mile Giving: Ingrained in Ebenezer's Culture

**O**ver fifteen years ago, Ebenezer's Church Council decided to invest in a ministry called "Second Mile Giving." Simply put, we decided to include funds in our annual budget for contributing to individuals and organizations in need of assistance.

"Second Mile Giving" is based on Matthew 5:41 – "Whosoever shall compel thee to go one mile, go with him two." Although the Church Council gave unanimous approval, there was some initial skepticism about deciding to give away money because Ebenezer was struggling to meet its other financial commitments. How could we give away money that we didn't have?

Probably more than any other decision ever made by the Council, the "Second Mile Giving" ministry totally reversed the direction of our Church. We stepped up in faith, stopped being limited by our inward focus and started our journey of focusing outside our Church. Then, guess what happened! Our entire Church expanded its ministry and outreach. We met all of our financial obligations while expanding our budget, and we completed and paid for a major addition to our Church.

Since beginning "Second Mile Giving," we have been constantly reminded by Jesus' words in Luke 17: 10 – "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty.'" Jesus is clearly telling us that, as Christians, we need to go beyond our duty, and willingly and joyfully do more than asked or expected.

Through "Second Mile Giving," we have helped individuals, families, and organizations spiritually and financially. We have shown our love by contributing to charities and community organizations; helping victims of natural disasters; providing food, clothing and school supplies to those in need; remembering those who are sick; supporting missions and paying attention to our children and young people.

While we take great pride in helping others, the real blessing has been to our Church family. Without a doubt, "Second Mile Giving" has been – and continues to be – instrumental in the excitement, love and caring at Ebenezer. If you want to experience real joy, attend our Church Council meetings where deciding how to give money away through "Second Mile Giving" is the highlight of our discussions.
