Encouraged, Jesus is Coming

As Christians we are encouraged because we know Jesus will return as promised and take us to heaven, but that encouragement should not be disguised as contentment with the knowledge that we have made it and apathy as to whether or not others do. The second coming of Jesus will be real and not a figurative thing. It will actually be Jesus returning in a way that every man, woman and child will see Him. Revelation 1:7, "Look, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and all the peoples of the earth will mourn because of him. So shall it be! Amen."
