TRAIL GATES CLOSING

Amana Colonies Historical Sites Foundation will be closing the trail gates between the Millrace and Lily lake. Gates will close at approximately 8am on Monday, November 4th and reopen Thursday, November 7th around 8am.

At this time, Superior Grading and Land Management will be putting in two inlet tubes and gates from the Millrace to the Lily Lake. Along with one overfill outlet tube from the Lily Lake to the Millrace. The inlet tubes will be lowered to hopefully allow water to sit in the tubes at all times, supplying the Lily Lake when the Millrace allows.

Tuesday, Nov. 5 is the national general election. Polls will be open 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. Lenox and Hilton precincts will cast ballots at the Middle Amana Fire Station, Middle Amana, Iowa. Washington and Hilton precincts will vote at the Hilton Township Hall, 550 7th Ave. in Conroy.

Bring your driver's license or an acceptable form of ID to the polling place. If you are unsure what an acceptable form of ID is, please check the Iowa Secretary of State website or contact the Iowa County Auditor's office at 319-642-3923.

Acceptable forms of identification listed on the website include: current lowa driver's license, current US passport, current US military ID or US veteran's ID, tribal id, Voter "pin" card also known as a voter ID card. If you do not have an acceptable form you may have someone attest to your identity. The "attester" must provide proper identification for themselves
