The time to submit your reports and narratives for the Department awards is quickly approaching! There are two awards for Education: The **Jean Batley Plaque** for Units of membership 150 or under and the **Chrysteen Fritzinger Plaque** for Units of membership 151 or higher.

The rules are the same for both awards:

- Any Unit in the Department of Arizona may receive these awards in the appropriate membership category.
- Judging will be based on actual participation in Scholarships, both Loan and Gift, educational programs in both high school and grammar schools, and extra activity done.
- Unit Education reports must be into the Department Education Chairman on or before the deadline date for reports or date designated by the Department Chairman (May 1st).
- A narrative report of the work accomplished in this program must be included with the report to be eligible for these awards. The narrative must be typewritten, not to exceed 1,000 words. (Refer to the Department Awards Rules and Regulations manual for further details on writing the narrative.)

The Education Year-End report form was included in the packet distributed at Fall Conference, as well as previous Department newsletters. The report forms and narratives are due to this Chairman by May 1st.

I look forward to hearing how your Units promote the Auxiliary education programs throughout the school year.

FINANCE

"Time is wasting" and it won't be long until FINANCE REPORTS ARE DUE TO THIS CHAIRMAN FROM **BOTH ALL UNITS AND DISTRICTS. DEADLINE DATE TO BE RECEIVED BY ME IS** MAY 15, 2020.

Surprises in store for most complete & well written report using the Department Presidents theme of "Serving Those Behind the Badge". Now to the nitty gritty – there will be no "lame" excuses for not filing a report. Ie. I never got a report form. Every Unit President, Secretary & District received a copy of the report form some months ago – so there goes that poor excuse – FIND IT& GET YOUR FACTS TOGETHER & REPORT.

As I have stated many times, Units must an EIN number with the Internal Revenue Service-this is a MANDATE FROM THE NATIONAL ORGANIZTION and you must file yearly, if you do not file yearly and miss reporting for 3 years you are no longer have your EIN and to refile with the Internal Revenue Service. Also you need to be registered with the Secretary of State as a Veterans organization as a 501-C-3 group, same as with IRS you should be registered with the AZ Corporation Commission. These 3 should be registered yearly by each Unit.

UNITS need to be informed of the various regulations in the UNIT GUIDEBOOK REVISED 2019. It's up to your Unit Officers to be informed of the regulations therein, what you can do & can't do. This last National Convention brought about some of the most drastic changes to the ELIGIBILITY RULES for someone to join our American Legion Auxiliary.

As officers you all need to know of these changes and how you can educate your membership. This is a learning experience but necessary to every member.

The last few days have brought to everyone challenges that may affect the health and livelihood of every United States citizen – Remember who you are and the fine organization that you belong to.-.Remember your neighors, your Families and FRIENDS.

Legislative

April 2020

Greetings,

First and foremost, I want to thank National and the Department of Arizona to allow me the opportunity to attend the 2020 Washington DC Conference last month.

I learned so much while I was in DC. On Monday March 9, 2020, I attended the National Security Commission meeting and the National Cemetery Committee meeting, which is a VA and R subcommittee. Legislative and National Security go hand in hand. Many of our bills that Congress and the State Legislatures pass are National Security related. The National Security meetings had panel speakers from USAID and the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition. USGLC is a non-partisan, and non-profit organization based in Washington DC. We also had podium speakers at the meeting. One in particular was LT General Karen H. Gibson US Army, who was a Girls State delegate, advocate for female veterans and speaks very highly of the American Legion. She is in Army Intelligence with specialty in National Security and Counter Intelligence.

On Tuesday, your American Legion Department of Arizona Delegation stormed Capitol Hill. First we met with Senator Martha McSally. Next stop on the Hill was Congressman Andy Biggs, then Congresswoman Debbie Lesko, and Congressman David Schweikert. Our meetings with our Senator and Representatives were very productive and went very well. All seemed to be interested in what the American Legion had to say.

Tuesday night concluded with a dinner in honor of our Boys' State Samsung Scholarship recipient Mason Whitaker and family.

Wednesday I attended the National Commander's Call, before his testimony before Congress. That afternoon, we were all on our way home.

There are probably 300 resolutions and bills to be brought before Congress relating to veterans and their families. Key ones are Toxic Exposures and Burn Pits, Healthcare for Women Veterans, Support VA's Suicide-Prevention Efforts, Reaffirm Commitment to our Allies, Fully Fund a Superior National Defense, Pay our Coast Guard, Implement and Oversee New Laws, Protect the GI Bill, Help End Veteran Homelessness, Support for Gold Star Families, and to Protect the American Flag. These key legislative points were discussed with all our Senators and Representatives while on the Hill.

Again, thank you for this opportunity and let's look forward to Congress passing these bills and resolutions for our veterans and families.

You can only control your efforts to motivate them to attend. So, if you make no effort at all, there is almost a 100% probability that no one will come.

UAV 7 MARCH 2020 UNOFFICIAL MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m. by Chairman Dylan Dalzotto. The opening ceremony was conducted and guests were introduced.

Jessica Winter, Public Information Liaison for Arizona Registrar of Contractors gave a presentation on an upcoming event at Chase Field, 401 E. Jefferson Street, Phoenix 85004 on April 1st, 2020. The Arizona Registrar of Contractors is a State agency responsible for investigating complaints and unlicensed contractors. If you need to hire a contractor, they need to have a license. The organization has a veteran on staff to answer any questions from veterans and to help them acquire a license. Woody Cline, Gila County Supervisor gave an update on the "Young Project". The Federal Forestry Services has abandoned the property in Young, Arizona which they previously maintained as their corporate offices for forestry personnel and operations and moved their headquarters to Payson. The property in Young has numerous buildings, most of which are in excellent condition. Working with Representative Gosar, the community is working to have the 90 acre property turned over to Young to convert the property into an area for veterans retreats and seminars. There are some historical buildings on this property which the program would have to maintain. Additionally there are two sets of barracks with ten bedrooms. Young has a population of about 1,000 people and the elevation is 5157 feet. Representative Gosar is introducing a bill to transfer the ownership of this property to the Gila County within the next couple of weeks. Roll call was taken, a quorum was established. Carol Culbertson made a motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as written, second and approved.

Treasurer Ray Boucher gave the treasurer's report. Starting balance was \$97,114 and ending balance was \$97,085.

Dr. Maureen McCarthy from the VA Medical Facilities updated the group on some of the construction ongoing at the VA. The new elevator to take patients from the emergency room to other floors for tests and housing is almost complete. The SAIL scores have improved from 79% to 84%. More people are responding to the surveys. The TeleICU opened this past month. There were 17 veterans in the U.S. who tested positive for the Corona virus. The symptoms do not show up for 10 to 14 days after exposure.

Rachel Charles from the National Memorial Cemetery updated everyone on the ongoing construction at the cemetery. The administration offices still have not moved into the trailers. Help will be needed for placement of the flags on the graves for Memorial Day. The flags will be placed on Saturday, May 23rd.

Nicole Baker from Arizona Department of Veterans Services advised that the new Veterans Homes in Yuma and Flagstaff are ahead of schedule and should be opening soon. They will be hosting a Women's Veterans Seminar in Lake Havasu. The new Pre-911 MFRF opened in January. So far they have been able to assist 4 families. There are also funds available to help veterans in need of additional schooling to advance their careers. Another project the ADVS is undertaking is an attempt to have more affordable housing for veterans. The Arizona Department of Veterans Services currently has 400 people in their employment.

Terry Araman gave a Legislative update. There are 2 bills the UAV is concentrating on. The one to increase the number of Benefits Counselors and the one to eliminate state taxation of military retirement. The bill for 12 additional Benefits Counselors has been amended to 6 additional counselors, with the intent to go in next year to ask for another 6. Working with Arizona Housing Coalition to support HB2732, which will make it more feasible for developers to build more affordable housing.

Also SB1494 is an attempt to reinstate the Housing Trust Fund to help people facing eviction, or problems paying for their utilities.

Chairman Dalzotto announced that they are still seeing nominations for the Class of 2020 AVHOF. Deadline for submission is March 31st.

The Spring Gala will be on May 8th at the Double Tree Resort in Scottsdale.

There being no further business to come before the membership, the closing ceremony was held and the meeting adjourned at 11:38 a.m.
