If you are at the top traveling down, and cannot extend the rail, please ask someone to help you! Please fold it back up when you are done (or ask someone to help you). The reason the old chair broke was that someone did not extend the track and the chair controls were mangled when the stair got stuck at the bottom. Unfortunately all electronics are located on the bottom, downward side. Since this chair is a vital (and expensive) piece of equipment to allow some of our less mobile members access to the dining room, please treat it gently! Thank you to Vice Commodore Chris Morano and Toby Doyle for finding and installing the replacement chair.

#### River Room Update:

You may or may not have noticed that we now have a new small fridge with ice maker in the River Room kitchen. This allows members access to ice when there is a private function upstairs and access to the main ice machine is difficult. Please treat this machine gently and close the door firmly after use. ## **REGATTA UPDATE:**

The 6th edition of the Annual Cross Sound Challenge was held on Sept 22nd under ideal sailing conditions. The first day of fall brought sunny skies, crisp air, and plenty of steady breeze out of the north/northwest for much of the day. As the event name implies, the Race Committee sent the fleet south "across the sound" to a mark off of Truman Beach after a reaching leg over to the east end of Long Sand Shoal. Attentive skippers (present company excluded) who noted an expected wind shift from NW to N dug into the east on the downwind leg and found themselves rounding the leeward mark at the top of their respective classes. The upwind beat back to Long Sand Shoal presented an array of strategic choices with plenty of wind shifts and an ever present ebb tide. The final leg back to the finish was a fast reach that provided good photo opportunities for all.

The regatta committee would like to especially thank the Mystic River Mudheads for serving as excellent PRO stewards of this years race. Safe, reliable, and smart race management is a rare skill in our sport, and the Cross Sound Challenge has gained an excellent reputation with their partnership. Just as important are the contributions we have from our membership. A special thank you to **Deb & Pete Martin** for volunteering *Makai* to serve as committee boat, and **Larry Stewart** volunteering on *Gypsy Soul* as the mark boat.

In total, 20 boats in 3 fleets represented 6 local area yacht clubs, including 7 from ECYC. Featuring everything from high performance trimarans and a J/133 to heavier ocean cruisers like club classics *Tesoro, Dorian, Petrel*, and *Blue Jacket*, the course legs offered up points of sail to suit everyone.
