Joan and I decided to take a little road trip, about 900 miles worth, to get prepared for the upcoming trip to the Convention in Dayton Oh. But first I decided to replace the fan bearing. During the operations check at the Wisconsin Convention last year, we were hearing a noise that sounded like a bearing, We thought we located the problem, the idler bearing shaft was moving in it's mounting bracket. Joe Gleaton and I scoured the vendors, inside and out, and finally found one, RED powder coated, that felt and sounded "good", so I installed it. It seemed to help what I was hearing, but after several conversations about the possible effects of the temperature necessary to powder coat on

the grease in the bearings, I decided this one might not be a good long term solution, so I searched a little more and found that Louis Pinard had a newly rebuilt one, which I bought, and installed when we got home. Not satisfied, I found the alternator was "the noise", so I removed it, replaced the bearings, they were dry and the shield had come out and was rubbing. Still thinking about the upcoming Dayton trip, we decided in the interest of time, to order a complete upper housing with the new bearings and hub installed in it. I received it, got it installed. We drove the Ramp to the May meeting at Dickies, running good, so we are ready!

On Friday May 17th we left and shortly after, the rain started and more or less continued for the ride to Oneonta, Al.,300 miles. Sat. morning 18th, sprinkling, we headed to the Corvairs by the River Show, put on by the Vulcans and Choo Choo clubs, and before we made the short run, the rain stopped. There was about 40 or so people and 18 Corvairs. We had a good gathering and lunch, then lined up for the rally to the Easley Covered Bridge for pictures.
