Ponderings from Pastor Peter

This last month we did something that we have been hoping to do for years, we planted a garden. It's not a very large garden by any means, it only took an afternoon of work to put things together and get things started, and we're hoping that next year we can do quite a bit more. But it's a garden, none the less... and for us that is a big thing.



You see, in the last 11 years of our marriage we have moved 12 times. Between college and seminary, we have found ourselves moving this way and that—always bouncing between new locations new experiences, new places and new possibilities. But nearly every spring we have been working on packing boxes for one reason or another... until now. And this spring, we planted a garden.

This new event in our life got me thinking about what it actually means to plant a garden or a tree or even a shrubbery. As one plants a garden, one looks to the future. There is a sense of hope that one day there will

be a harvest of delicious fruit and veggies from those little sprouts. There is also a commitment made to those plants—that one will watch over them and guide their growth; weeds will be pulled, roots will be watered, perhaps even fertilizer will be used... continual care must be given to help a create a strong, healthy plant—a plant that will one day hopefully bear good fruit. I think of our forefathers and foremothers who planted this garden of a congregation. While financial gifts are always good, your gift of presence and care within the garden are just as important if not more so. The garden takes work—but the rewards are delicious for all. From Pastor Peter: Arkansas-Oklahoma Synod 31st Annual Synod Assembly REPORT

This year's theme was Building Bridges: Race, Diversity and Justice. The Assembly started Friday, May 4 and ended Sunday, May 6.

We had two keynote speakers. One was Ms. Judith Roberts (ELCA Program Director for Racial Justice), and the other was Dr. Cynthia Nance (Dean Emeritus University of Arkansas). Some takeaways from these talks included a "fish bowl" activity, information on implicit bias (for an assessment visit <u>www.projectimplicit.net</u>), a roadmap to the different types of racism, and the review of the ELCA social statement Freed in Christ: Race, Ethnicity, and Culture.

We had three different "Grace Note" talks that expanded on our theme during the assembly. Speakers included Heather Pratt, Ava Fisher and Hannah DiPasquale. By the way Hannah is from Salem and Cluster 4...woo hoo.

We heard many reports and voted on a few resolutions. Just a few of the reports included Living God's Abundance, Partners in Mission, Oaks Indian Mission, Lutheran Planned Giving, Prison Ministry, ELCA, LYO, Kairos, Bethany Lutheran College and Global Missions (another Cluster 4 presenter, Cindy Pennie).

Bishop Mike gave his report and an overview of the Synod's Strategic Mission Plan, "Bolder Brighter Together!" Something that was said that really stuck with me was this statement, "If we focus on what we don't have, we only focus on what we can't do."

During Pastor Liz's Report, the Assembly got to experience using the Curiosity Cards like we used at our Cluster 4 Retreat in Ponca City last fall.

We had the election for Synod VP. Holly Lantagne won the election. Holly has served as our Synod's secretary for the past few years. Additionally, she is one of two of our Synod attorneys. She is an attorney by trade and lives in Norman. Holly is a member of University Lutheran Church.

We also voted on our Synod's 5 voting members to the 2019 Churchwide Assembly in Milwaukee. Pastor Peter Olson was also elected to represent our synod and congregations on the national level.

Two sets of workshops were held the afternoon on Saturday. One included a field trip to the John Hope Franklin Park and Reconciliation Center. There was also a session that viewed the movie <u>Traces of the Trade</u> along with a discussion. Other workshop topics included "Building Bridges" and "Unpacking the Knapsack". Cluster 4's own Pastor Sally Houck (from Stillwater) was one of the "Unpacking the Knapsack" facilitators.

A whole group debrief on all of the workshops was a helpful way to get a flavor of all the sessions even if you didn't get to attend them. That's how I discovered about the power of the John Hope Franklin Park and Reconciliation Center. This is now on my "Tulsa Sites to Visit" list.

A Resolution and Memorial to show support Arkansas Poor People's Campaign (APPC) was passed by the assembly. Additionally, a Memorial on the ELCA's 50th anniversary of the ordination of women was approved.

We had two worship services. Friday evening worship was led by Pastor Liz and Bishop preached. Sunday Eucharist was presided by Pastor Alvaro Nova Ochoa and special guest Judith Roberts preached. Special offerings at both services were for Blast Off for Books (LYO to take to Youth Gathering in Houston) and Into the Light (An organization to bring awareness and education to the issue of human sex trafficking). The services were beautiful.
