- Brush and branches: bermuda grass okav
- Vegetable peelings, fruit and vegetables including pumpkins, carrot peels, broccoli stems, lettuce, apple cores and peels, etc.
- Wood ashes (cold), Paper plates & napkins (non-coated)
- Prunings maximum 4' long and 11/2" in diameter. Christmas trees cut to fit in container (no flocking, tinsel, decorations or stand)

#### Put veggies in your vard debris can.

Wrap veggies in newspaper or brown paper bag. Put the food waste, including soiled paper, in your cart. You can also freeze your food waste before placing it in your cart.

#### Place vardwaste cans/carts at curb every week:

- Set container at curb the night before your regular collection day.
- Leave three (3) feet space between containers.
- · All vardwaste must be inside container. Loose material will not be collected.
- Do not put yardwaste in plastic bags.



Do NOT place batteries or fluorescent lamps in the garbage or recycling, they are considered toxic waste. See options:
