GIVING THANKS By Michael Albetta President, Lake Ridge Civic Association



ELECTION SEASON IS HERE

Yes, it is time for Elections for your Lake Ridge Civic Association Board of Directors!

If you would like to be a candidate for the Board, here is how you qualify. You are a member of the Lake Ridge Civic Association in good standing* and:

- upon written petition of at least two Regular Members, or
- a verbal nomination and a second at the November General Membership meeting (Nov. 19th)

At our Annual Meeting, January 21st, the Nominating Committee shall present the proposed slate to the General Membership for consideration and vote. All regular members who are in good standing* shall be eligible to vote. Election shall be by a simple majority vote of those regular members present at the January meeting. (*Good standing is defined as having paid membership fees on or before the January meeting, and complied with his or her obligations to the community.)

The Board of directors shall consist of a maximum of seven or a minimum of five elected Directors. The Board of Directors will elect from its ranks the four presiding Officers. President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Other members of the Board of Directors will fill At-Large positions.

Use LED Holiday Lights

LED lights can last up to 10 times longer, use 80% less energy than traditional incandescent holiday lights and are ENERGY STAR qualified. They are also more durable and shock resistant than other lights because they do not have moving parts, filaments or glass. They are now readily available at your local hardware store.

Re-charge it!

Every year more than 15 billion batteries are produced and sold worldwide — 40% of those are sold during the holidays. Many are alkaline batteries that are thrown out after just one use because they aren't recyclable. Replace your alkaline batteries with rechargeable ones. Newer models can charge in as little as 20 minutes! It saves you money and helps the environment at the same time.

Creative Gift Wrapping

Wrapping paper has a high-clay and low-paper content making it difficult to recycle. Instead, get creative and choose a reused/reusable alternative like comics, posters, maps, blueprints or calendars (all recyclable), fabric, reusable paper or cloth gift bags, bandanas, etc. If you're shipping gifts, replace foam packaging or bubble wrap with plastic bags or glossy ads from newspapers (the ink doesn't smear like newspaper).

Stop Junk Mail

With the holidays come unwanted catalogs and other mail asking you to buy, buy, buy – but you can stop them and STAY off mailing lists. As soon as you receive an unwanted publication, call the 1-800 number located somewhere on the piece and ask to be removed from the mailing list and prevent future mailings.

GREENER HOLIDAYS

If Santa brings you new electronic toys, you may be wondering what to do with your old ones. TVs, cell phones, computer monitors and other electronic components contain heavy metals such as lead, mercury and arsenic. Tossing those into the trash means they will end up in our landfills and toxic chemicals will seep into our drinking water. Recycle them instead.

Fort Lauderdale is holding an Electronics and Household Hazardous Waste collection event from 9 am to 2 pm on **Saturday, January 23rd, at Mills Pond Park** (entry off Powerline Road north of NW 16th St). Drop off your unwanted electronics, paints, solvents, cleaners, and other household chemicals. Also consider disposing of expired or unneeded prescription drugs. Some of these items can be repurposed; others will be disposed of in a safe manner to protect our environment. Be sure to bring proof of residency (driver's license, utility bill, etc.)

Fort Lauderdale has teamed up with other neighboring cities to offer hazardous waste collections during the year. Check out FortLauderdale.gov/GYR-home-page for other collection dates and locations.

SAFE & HEALTHY HOLIDAYS

ENJOY THE HOLIDAYS, DON'T BECOME A VICTIM

The holiday season is upon us; unfortunately that also means that crime steps up. This is the time of the year that will call for massive shopping in-store and online. People will come knocking on your door, both literally and figuratively with their hands out looking for donations for the hungry, the poor and downtrodden. Our hearts break and our hands dig in our pockets, pens whip out to write checks. I am not here to knock "goodwill" out of your heart, talk you out of buying gifts for your loved ones or to brand all requests for charity as bogus, but I am here to remind you to be prudent. I am also not going to re-invent the wheel. The following is a list of Crime prevention Tips I found on Broward County Sherriff's Office website as well as a tip posted on WSVN.com, November 5, 2014, for you online shoppers.

- When parking your vehicle to go shopping, remember where you parked it! Always park in a well lit and well traveled area. Do not park in a remote dark area.
- When you return to your vehicle, scan the interior of your car to be sure no one is hiding inside. Check to see if you are being followed.
- Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle. You will be ready to unlock the door and will not be delayed by fumbling and looking for your keys.
- When storing items purchased at the stores, place them out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Do not leave your purse, wallet, or cellular telephone in plain view.



- Don't resist if someone tries to take any of your belongings. Don't chase someone who robs you, they may have a weapon. Instead call 911.
- Lock your vehicle and put up your windows even while you are driving.
- If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well lit and in a safe location.
- Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- If you make a purchase with your credit card, be sure to obtain the carbons or see that they are de-stroyed in front of you.
- Beware of the "a good deal" scams. Things are not always what they appear to be.
- If you are purchasing toys for small children, be sure that they are safe. You will be surprised what a small child can swallow or what can injure them.

Drive defensively. Traffic is heavier during the holidays. Drivers may also have indulged in too much holiday spirits.

On-line shoppers should request signature confirmation upon delivery; that way a package cannot be left on your front step. You can also contact the shipping company and arrange for delivery at a time you'll be home or, if you can, have your packages delivered to your place of business.



LIGHT UP LAKE RIDGE

With the change from Daylight Savings Time and the approach of winter, our streets will be darker for the next few months. In some areas of Lake Ridge, street lights don't provide adequate lighting for pedestrians and cyclists after sunset. One of our neighborhood's greatest assets is our expanding tree canopy, but in places, that can leave many shadowy areas for those on foot or bike, especially during long winter nights.

Some of the brightest spots in the neighborhood are those areas where our neighbors leave their porch lights on -- or perhaps keep their holiday lights up a little longer. That lighting, at the pedestrian level below the tree canopy, can make a big difference in the walkability of our streets after dark and helps us combat crime too If you have a porch light or landscape lighting, please consider leaving it on a little longer during the evening hours. If you use newer, energy efficient bulbs you can provide a lot of light for pennies. Solar powered landscape lighting is even cheaper and more eco-friendly. We can make the existing street lights more effective by trimming back trees and foliage near lightpoles. Your neighbors will appreciate the light you provide during their evening strolls -- and better lighting helps us combat crime, too.

Be sure to wear lighter-colored or reflective clothing when taking a walk after dark. In many parts of Lake Ridge you have to walk in the street. If you do, please walk or jog facing traffic. If you're biking, be sure you have reflectors and a headlight. For those who prefer a musical accompaniment to their nightly stroll or ride, please turn the volume down in your earbuds so that you can hear oncoming traffic. If you are driving after dark, please slow down and pay attention to pedestrians



and bicyclists sharing the road. At dawn and dusk, the low rising and setting winter sun can impair your vision, so exercise a little extra caution when driving then. After dark, turn your hi-beam headlights down while driving on city streets so oncoming drivers aren't blinded by your lights. And please be kind to your pets if you're walking your dog after dark or in the early morning, be sure Rover is on his leash so you can keep him safe.


