

**Parish Membership:** Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

**Sick & Shut-ins:** The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

**Baptisms:** Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

**Marriages:** In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

**Parish Council:** Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

**Holy Name Society:** Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

**Rosary Altar Society:** Meets on the Monday evening after the first Sunday of the month. President, Liz Mulvaney

WHAT CROSS THAT I HAVE TO BEAR DO I NEED HELP WITH?



the Messiah!

Our celebration today begins with the jubilation and adulation of crowds of people drawn to Jesus upon His triumphant entrance to Jerusalem. He has healed the lame! He has given sight to the blind! He has driven out the devil! He has raised the dead! Now He comes on a beast of burden to the center of their world, the home of the temple, the Sanhedrin, and the governor of all Judea, Pontius Pilate. What will He do next? He is the Messiah, destined to be king. Expectations could not be higher. Hosanna to

Today we hear the people of Jerusalem, make two very different cries. As we commemorate the Lord's entrance into the city, we welcome their cheers of "Hosanna," showering praises upon their victorious king. But in the Passion, we hear their shouts of "Crucify Him," calling for His death. The people failed to see the Messiah for what He truly was. Their Messiah would surely end Roman rule, free the people, and bring perfect peace. Most importantly, He would do all this promptly and painlessly. Those who shouted, "Crucify Him" did not realize the necessity of His sacrifice, and so helped bring about His ultimate sacrifice.

Talk about being at the wrong place at the wrong time. Simon, the Cyrenian, father of two sons, had just entered Jerusalem from the country when Roman soldiers forced him to carry the cross of this condemned man. What went through his mind? This man must have done something really horrible, bleeding and stumbling, thorns sunk into His skull, surrounded on all sides by soldiers with whips and weapons. Now I have to shoulder this heavy burden. What if I fall or step wrong? Today, when we carry someone else's cross, we do not only share in their difficult burden, we also fear, what may happen. Will I be able to handle it? Will others see me a fool? Will I be dragged down with them? Can I be Simon?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah, could have taken the easy way out, turning away from His mission and avoiding more of the abuse He'd already received. As Paul points out, Christ Jesus could have avoided humbling Himself at anytime, using His divinity to avoid the cross. But each chose to remain obedient to the Lord. By putting themselves in the hands of God, we have been redeemed.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

What cross do I find difficult to shoulder myself? Whose burden have I been unwilling to share? How can I help someone else and/or allow myself to be helped?
