
Amber MacMahill being sworn in

Amber McMahill

Childrens Park


About one year ago, a group of stakeholders got together to discuss the possibilities of revitalizing the Childrens Park on the corner of 2nd and Main. The park lots were donated to the Aspen Valley Land Trust with a deed restriction to forever maintain it as a park. With the lots the old Jailhouse sits on belonging to the Town. Together, the AVLT, the Town Trustees, the Marble Charter School, the Parks and Recreation committee, and the Town Manager hired DHM design to create a plan. Included in the plan is the planting of new trees along the perimeter of second street, growing drought resistant grasses, rehabilitating the original baseball diamond, a landscaped corner housing an informative sign, and improved parking along 2nd street. A grant from Great Outdoors Colorado will fund the park project as well as the restoration project of the Jailhouse, spearheaded by Emma Bielski.



High Winds Bring Trees Down



Many residents in the Marble area lost sleep due to the high wind storm ripping through the valley on May 8th. Pictured above is a 50+ foot tree broken in half over the garage of Marble's town manager. The following day brought neighbors with chainsaws, tree service companies, looks-loo's, and a lot to clean up.



The biggest step in this process is the irrigation for the grass and wildflower landscape. The AVLT is responsible for the cost of installation, maintenance, and repairs of the water system which will be trenched along 2nd street, pumping water from the Crystal. Brent Compton, Owner of Verde Land Management has been hired as Project Manager.

Ideally, Compton says "The trench will be dug if all goes as planned in 3-4 weeks time. RA Enterprises will be there to place an electric pedestal in the park 10 ft from the center electric pole. The electric and irrigation line will run 565' to the river's edge where an enclosed stand alone pump station holding a 7.5 hP munro pump. A 3" intake hose will float in the rivers edge with an automated intake strainer on the end to prevent clogging up with debris. Once we get the electric, irrigation line and pump installed the next step in late June early July is to install automated irrigation rotors in the park. This will irrigate the turfgrass and trees as well as future wildflowers." Verde has already planted a handful of trees donated by Eagle Crest Nursery this spring. Soon enough the MCS Mountain Lions will have a place to play catch and work on their batting averages.





The Mill Site Park

Many folks have been working, on ideas for the enjoyment and safety of Marbles Parks. A simple yet beautiful design for a two tier amphitheater seating area nestled into the natural bowl shape before the stage of the Mill Site Park, has been in the works for some time. Greg Tonozzi says the idea came to fruition when Connie Hendrix, Alison Finn, and himself were on the Parks committee just a few years ago. The materials would be made of nothing other than marble, generously donated and cut by Colorado Stone Quarries, then carved and installed by Tonozzi. The sketch you see here was drawn by Charlie Manus, depicting the curvature and design mimicking the natural landscape. This project will commence this summer. Any and all community members interested in helping and being a part of this grand moment are welcome.
