# **Brass Syllabus**

Festival participants will be entered in one of the following categories. Grade levels are Toronto Conservatory (or equivalent) grade levels.

#### CATEGORIES

(Grade as of December 31st)		
Junior Brass	Junior Brass participants are currently registered in a graded program Levels	
Levels P-3	(Preparatory) - Level 3.	
Intermediate Brass	Intermediate Brass participants are	
Levels 4-7	currently registered in a graded program Levels 4 - 7.	
Senior Brass	Senior Brass participants are currently	
Levels 8-10	registered in a graded program Levels 8 - 10.	
Open Brass	Open Brass participants are over 19 and are not competing in above categories.

### CLASSES

- 1. **Canadian Music**: Select a composition from a recognized Canadian composer. Please use the internet to confirm Canadian status.
- 2. **Pre-Romantic Era:** Select a composition from a composer who lived in any era prior to and including the Romantic era.
- 3. **Impressionist**: Select a composition from the late 19th century: composers from this period include Debussy, Ravel, Roussel, Faure, Ibert, Poulenc, etc.

- 4. Twentieth and Twenty-First Century: Select a composition from the 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> Century: composers from this period include Kabalevsky, Prokofiev, Gretchaninoff, Bartok, Khatchaturian, etc.
- 5. **Popular Arrangement:** Select a composition from the popular repertoire of the Twentieth Century.
- 6. **Unaccompanied Solo:** Select a composition to perform without accompaniment.
- 7. Instrumental Duet: Select a composition written for two brass instruments from any of the grade appropriate classes given above. The duet may use piano accompaniment. Both performers must be in the same grade level category.

#### Sonata and Concerto Classes

Select a sonata or concerto within a grade-level appropriate category. Entries in the sonata/concerto competition may use a piano accompanist. Junior instrumentalists may play only one movement; intermediate, senior, and open instrumentalists may play two or three movements.

#### Instrumental Ensemble

Select two or three contrasting compositions and/or arrangements for an ensemble of brass performers. These two or three contrasting selections can be from any of the grade-appropriate classes given above. All performers in the ensemble must be in the same grade level category or enter the grade category of the most advanced member in the ensemble. Total performance time should not exceed 15 minutes.

#### Brass Rules and Guidelines

- Grade levels and music <u>must</u> be those determined by Toronto Conservatory (or equivalent). Pieces that are entered at the incorrect grade level, or are not from these syllabi may be performed at the Festival, but will be considered non-competitive and deemed <u>ineligible</u> for awards or scholarships.
- 2. The individual submitting the entry is responsible for entering the participant into the correct class(es). Pieces must be played as entered, with no changes accepted after the registration is submitted. (Please Note) Incorrect entries will be deemed as non-competitive and will NOT qualify for awards or scholarships. (For example, all movements of Sonatas must be entered in the Sonata/Concerto class.)
- 3. Participants have a brief time before their performance to tune to the piano that they will be performing with to make adjustments, as required.

- 4. Only original scores, or copies authorized by copyright owners may be used at the Festival. Copied scores are not accepted at the Festival, or Provincials.
- 5. Participants may choose to perform in the non-competitive division, but will not be eligible for awards and/or scholarships. This is determined at registration and cannot be changed prior to/or at the festival.
- 6. Performers <u>cannot</u> use recorded accompaniment.
- Participants may select to perform in one, or more classes. However, to be eligible for awards and scholarships, participants <u>must</u> enter in a <u>minimum</u> of <u>two</u> different classes in Brass. For example, a Brass performer can enter in the Canadian Music Class, and the Impressionist Class, etc.
- 8. Performers may not perform any selection he/she has previously won at the Kelowna Kiwanis Festival, or at the Provincial Festival.
